HINT—POST OFFICE.—Through delays in passenger trains from Montreal and West, mails for Prince Edward Island not infrequently miss the steamer connection causing considerable inconvenience to the commercial community. The mail, it is understood, is despatched from Montreal partly by C. P. R. and partly by the Ocean Ltd., which are both due to leave that city about 7.30 p. m.
