### THE RELEASE OF P. P. GILLIS.

There are few duties presented to a public writer that are as once more delicate and less pleasing than the criticism of an act of executive clemency on the part of the Lieutenant Governor. And yet the unpleasant duties must not be avoided when we meet them. The release of P. P. Gillis from jail before the expiry of his sentence furnishes a case in point. We have no personal animus against the released prisoner, whom we would not know if we met him on the street, and we have only the kindest feeling for Lieutenant Governor McKinnon.

The facts of the case appear to be that P. P. Gillis was convicted of a third offence against the Prohibitory Law about a year ago, sentenced to six months imprisonment and was released after serving two months in jail. In that case very strong influence, political, clerical and lay influence, including that of three or four well-known temperance men, was brought to bear to secure the release. To these influences was added, we believe, the solemn promise of Mr. Gillis not to again violate the law, and some sort of undertaking on the part of influential friends that if released he would keep the law.

Notwithstanding these influences, promises, and undertakings he was again charged, convicted, sentenced to jail and there confined. Now he is again released before the expiry of his term of sentence, and as we understand this has been done, as it could only be lawfully done, by the authority of the Lieutenant Governor. The blindest statement of these facts seems to call for an explanation that has not yet been given. We fail to conceive any explanation that can be given which will afford a justification. If any such satisfactory explanation is possible, in view of the gravity of the case it ought to be made public.

Other offenders against the Prohibitory Law have not been treated with like consideration. George Offer, if we remember rightly, was left to serve out a full six months term concurrently with the first sentence of imprisonment against Gillis. Women, with children needing their care have since been kept in jail for the full term of sentence. So far as the public are aware there were no just reasons for the executive clemency being extended to Gillis that did not apply with equal or stronger force to the cases of other offenders who were compelled to pay the full penalty for their offences.

Nothing could be more unfortunate than that there should be in this Province any reason to believe that either the administration of the law or the exercise of executive prerogative are moved or controlled by sinister influences. Justice and clemency must alike be even handed or justice ceases to be just and clemency degenerates to favoritism and caprice. The plain people who have a strong sense of justice are forming their judgment from day to day upon the public acts of our public men in high station, and we respectfully submit for the serious consideration of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, what must the verdict of the people be upon his action in the Gillis case from first to last?
