A CIVIC BY-ELECTION.

Councillor P. S. Brown having resigned his seat at the Council Board as representative of Ward Four, a by-election is advertised to take place on the 20th, to choose his successor. The law requires that such election shall be held within thirty days after such vacancy occurs. As several questions may arise in connection with the Ward election referred to, we may here cite the text of Section 8 of the Act of 1903 consolidating and amending the Incorporation Act. It reads as follows:

"If any extraordinary vacancy shall occur in the office of Mayor or Councilor of the said city the persons qualified to be elected on a day to be fixed by the Mayor or a majority of the Councilmen, such day not being later than thirty days after such vacancy elect from the persons qualified to fill such office another person duly qualified to fill such vacancy and such election shall be held, and the voting and other proceedings be conducted in the same manner and subject to the same provisions as are hereinafter provided."

Attention is directed to the words "another person duly qualified." It would seem from the letter of the law as contained in the section quoted that the electors are bound to select another person than the Councilor who resigned in other words that a Councilor who resigns is not eligible for immediate re-election. The question may be one for judges and lawyers rather than laymen to decide, and we shall bow to the judgment of those learned in the law in that regard. The point is none the less one of timely interest.

Japan is by no means naturally a rich agricultural country. Of 15 million acres in the islands of Japan proper but little more than one seventh part is made up of arable land. Fifty-five per cent of the families who live by agriculture cultivate less than two acres each; thirty per cent cultivate from two to three acres each and only 15 per cent have larger holdings than that. But the farming of Japan is intensive, and with close economy such a small plot of land is able to live in contentment.

THE GUARDIAN'S ELECTION RETURNS.

The issue of yesterday morning's edition, of The Charlottetown Guardian was 3,908 copies, being the largest edition ever issued by this newspaper. On December 13th, 1904, the day following the general local elections of that year, the issue was 1650. The advance is, we think really noteworthy.

Our election returns included not merely the general result in each electoral division, but the complete number of votes cast for every candidate in almost every polling division throughout the Island, together with a like record for the general election of 1900, furnished for purposes of comparison. In the larger Provinces there is no newspaper which attempts to give so complete a record.

It is a great satisfaction to The Charlottetown Guardian to be able thus to give on the morning following the day of election such full and complete returns, and to know that the work is appreciated by our readers. In this connection we desire to acknowledge with thanks the valuable services of Manager Winsell and his staff of the P. E.
