FROM OUTSIDE THIS PROVINCE.

**NEW YORK, March 7**—That the death of 3-year-old Louise Orpicello who died in an ambulance on the way to St. Mary's Hospital, Hoboken, was due to alcoholic poisoning was the report of Dr. G. W. Dradwell, who was called in by the father to treat the child.

On Thursday night there was a christening at the Orpicello home at 584 First street. Unnoticed by anyone the little girl got hold of its contents. She was found some of a bottle of wine and drank part time later unconscious.

**ST. JOHN, March 7**—Future generations will witness the Borden cabinet at work in the privy council chamber. It will be a real cinematograph picture showing the leaders of the nation taking sweet counsel together.

On Saturday for half an hour the cinematograph men were busy in the privy council chamber before a full cabinet with their machines, and they came away pleased at the good impression, which will be shown to seventy millions of people throughout the world when they are ready.

The pictures are part of a scheme to write a cinematograph picture history of Canada from the days of Jacques Cartier up to the present premier.

And royalty will figure in the picture. The picture men by royal permission attended the skating party at government house and caught the duke moving about, the duchess receiving her guests and pretty Princess "Pat" gracefully figuring on the ice with a crowd of Ottawa's gayest and brightest.

The premier in his sumptuous private office was caught in the act of writing letters and dictating to his private secretary, all for future Canadians to gloat over in wondering interest.

Speaker Landry in the senate posed clad in his crimson robe, while Speaker Sproule preceded by the sergeant-at-arms, represented the walk from his private apartments to the green chamber. And the premier was not forgotten. He smiled over again his famous smile and walked down Parliament Hill, all for the benefit of future statesmen, who will want to know how it was done in the year of 1912. The press gallery "boys" are also included and room eight, with its dozens of typewriters, roll-topped desks, voluminous bins, books and diligent inhabitants perform specially under the inquisitive eye of the clicking machine.

When the history is complete a special set will be sent to His Majesty King George, who will have Canada as she is, placed before him.

**BELLEVILLE, March 7**—The striking force of the German navy is practically certain, will be increased almost a third by the naval measures which soon will be submitted to the Reichstag. These will, it is understood, provide the men and money for commissioning a third squadron of eight reserve battle ships which will be kept fully manned and in constant service, so that they will form to all intents and purposes an integral part of the active battle fleet. Four of these ships, all of

them members of the active fleet which participated in the great naval review last summer, will be available during the year and the other four within another eighteen months.

Public attention in Germany and abroad, particularly in Great Britain which has been concentrated on the more sensational issue of laying down during the next six years six new mammoth "battle cruisers" not provided for by the organic law governing the construction of the German fleet, has failed to notice the significance of the proposals for the reserve ships.

The original Naval act, providing for a fleet of thirty-four battle ships half to constitute the active fleet and half to be in reserve, specifically declared that half the reserve units should be kept in commission with full crews. Owing to financial reasons and the difficulty of training officers and men fast enough to man the big ships of the new navy, this reserve fleet has consisted of only two little antiques, the Wittelbach and the Kaiser Wilhelm II., which with their 9.4 inch guns are mere pygmies beside modern battle ships.

With the large number of new dreadnoughts completion the Admiralty not only has been able to get together for the first time the full complement of seventeen battle ships including the fleet flagship, required for the high sea fleet, but will also be able to commission in the reserve four fairly modern ships of the Blücher class, which under the old system would join the others now laid up to the harbor spiles. They are barely eight years old and carry each four of the Krupp 11-inch guns which German experts consider equal to the 12-inch guns carried in foreign navies. Another batch of dreadnoughts, to be finished in 1913 or the Spring of 1914, will force four sister ships from the high sea fleet two complete squadrons, each of eight modern dreadnoughts.

The Kaiser the Kaiserin and the Frederick der Grosse, which were launched last Autumn, the Prinzregent Luitpold, launched last month, and the King Albert which is almost ready, are said to carry ten 12-inch guns, two less than their predecessors. As, however, the new ships are rated at 24,500 tons nearly two thousand tons larger than their predecessors of the Ostfriesland class, which carry the new 35 centimetre (13.75 inch) gun made by the Krupp.

The Krupp works have now completed and tested, it is stated, 14-inch and even 15-inch guns for battle ships. If, as is stated, the Krupp have been able to increase the bore of the gun and at the same time the projectile to this extent without diminishing the muzzle velocity of the shot, the newest Krupp model promises to stand unequalled for a long time to come.

Flat Point—Heavy close packed distant, two miles moving southeast.


