Says Church Union Liked Tired Horse

PASSES THREE PROVINCES BUT GETS HEEBIES IN ONTARIO

(TORONTO STAR APRIL 9TH.) Church Union was liked to a played-out horse trying to navigate the "Grand Ecclesiastical Steeplechase," said Rev. T. W. Goodwill, formerly of Charlottetown, F. E. L. who acted as chairman, at a mass meeting of Presbyterians of Riverdale district, opposed to organic union with the Methodist and Congregational Churches, held last night.

Rev. Mr. Goodwill said that the progress which had been made by Church Union reminded him of Spark Plug. It had managed to make its way through Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba, but had stopped when it reached Ontario. When it reached this Province it developed a bad case of "Heebies." They held the old horse up, and said it was pretty well lathered and timbered but lacked plaster. Ontario was to furnish plaster but there appeared to be something wrong somewhere. Old man Ontario said: "We will inspect the horse," and Ontario had every right to inspect it.

"If the General Assembly had been as careful in handling the situation as the Ontario Government had been," said the Speaker, "we would not be in the middle that we are in today."

He said that one of the chief claims put forward for Church Union was that it would eliminate overlapping but it so happened that it fell far short of accomplishing that object. If instead of organic Union of three churches those behind the movement had worked toward a federated endeavor which would also include the Church of England and the Baptist Church it would have been something worth striving for.

IN MEMORIAM

MR. JAMES GREEHAN

The late Mr. James Greehan whose death took place on April 12th inst., at his home was a life long resident of Newton, Lot 26, being born there in the year 1844 shortly after his parents had emigrated from Ireland.

This settlement was then in its infancy with very little land cleared and only a few log houses built so that it may be truly said that Mr. Greehan was one of the pioneers who helped to make this part of the province what it is.

About four weeks ago he contracted a severe cold which he was unable to overcome and was confined to the house during which time he had the best medical attendance and nursing but on account of his advanced years there was little hope for his recovery and realizing that his end was near he had the consolation of frequent visits from his pastor Rev. M. J. Smith who also administered sacraments of Holy Church.

During his long lifetime he was an ideal man of the "old school" and strictly lived up to his ideals of truth, honesty, sobriety, industry and perseverance in his chosen vocation, which added materially to his success and prosperity.

Although unmarried he took a great interest in schools, churches and other institutions which stood for the welfare and advancement of the young people and always generously contributed his share to benefit them.

In his young days it was difficult to get an education but being gifted with an originality and companionable conversation affirmed by sound and logical ideas made him a favorite among his fellow-men and always adhering to the "Golden Rule" left without an enemy.

His passing to the great beyond has bereft the community of a good loyal citizen, a true and faithful member of the Catholic church during his exemplary life on earth.

His funeral took place on the 14th inst. at St. Malachi's church, Kinkora when a Mass of Requiem was sung for the repose of his soul after which his remains were interred in the church cemetery.

His named pall bearers were: Michael Mulligan, Francis Carr, Patrick Smith, P. J. Cairns, Edward McKenna and James G. Greenan.

He leaves to mourn one brother, Francis, at home. May his soul rest in peace.

Anglo-Russian Conference

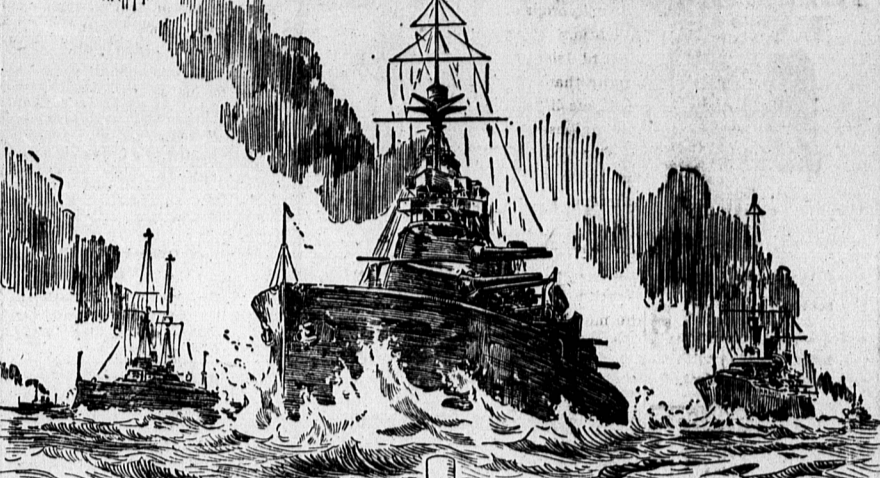
