NEW YORK, May 31—(AP)—While the foreign exchange market weighed implications of the Russian refusal to join the British-French bloc under current proposals, business in foreign currencies slowed to a trickle.

Price changes in relation to the sterling advanced 3-16 cent to 84.68 5-16 and the belga edged another 1/16 cent to 25.70. The French franc was unchanged at 2.65 while the guilder dipped 1/16 cent to 53.70. The Canadian dollar was firm, picking up 1-16 to 73-32 per cent discount.

MONTREAL, May 31—(CP)—A 49 1/2 on Montreal foreign exchange today while the United States dollar and French francs held unchanged. The dollar was quoted at 1.00 7-32 and the franc at 2.65 9-16.

Livestock

MONTREAL, May 31—(CP)—Receipts on Montreal livestock markets today were 56 cattle, 97 calves, 469 hogs and three sheep and lambs.

Cattle were slow and no early sales were made. Calves were slow and easier. Veal ranged from \$4.75 for common light kinds to \$7 for good veals. Drinkers sold down to \$4.

Hogs were lower. Bacon's made \$4.60 and watered. Selects drew \$1 premium with the regular cuts on off grades. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$12.35 cold weight.

On Maritime markets all live stock prices were unchanged. Hogs sold at \$11.35 rail grade hot weight and at \$8.40 off trucks. Sows were \$7.80 dressed and \$5.65 off trucks.

Choice steers brought \$9.75, good \$6 medium \$5.25 fair \$4.75 and common \$4. Choice heifers brought \$6.25, good \$5.75, medium \$5, fair \$4.25 and common \$3 to \$3.75. Top cows brought \$5, good \$4.50, fair \$4, and cutters \$2.75 to \$3. Boning bulls were \$3 to \$3.25 and butcher bulls \$3.25 to \$4.25.
