A good program has been prepared for the Recital at the School of Music on Thursday, Nov. 23, and a good attendance is required to make it a success. Everyone should encourage the musical talent by their presence.

Among invited guests for the State Dinner at Government House, Ottawa last Thursday night in honor of the Duke and Duchess of Connaught were His Honor Lieutenant Governor Rogers, of P. E. Island, Sir Louis Davies and Hon. David Laird.

The S. S. Cabot is due to arrive in this port early this morning with a cargo of Sydney coal for C. Lyons & Co. The S. S. Kilkeel will be due tomorrow morning with Inverness Coal. The schooners Nellie Read and Polar Star are discharging Pictou coal for the same firm.

In the city market yesterday butternut sold at twenty-five to twenty-eight cents a pound, eggs at twenty-seven to twenty-nine cents a dozen, and turkeys at twelve cents a bushel. These were the only changes in the market prices as will be seen by the itemized list elsewhere in this issue.

Bennett, from North Sydney with P. E. Island produce. Schr. Patriot, 97 tons, Capt. Samson, unloading P. E. I. produce at Market Street at the Pier. Schr. Lavanda, 43 tons, Capt. Winchester, discharging P. E. I. produce at new wharf in Brookman's Cove. Schr. W. P. O'Hara, McLean, from Crapaud, with produce. Schr. Bona Fides, White, Charlottetown, produce.

A recent visitor to the embryo fox ranch at Milton Station was courteously shown through by its owner and proprietor, D. Howard. Mr. Howard was induced to sell his fine farm at North Milton and purchase the smaller one of Mr. Tyrell at Milton, being lured by the visions of a fortune to be made by the breeding of Reynard. Standing on the face of a hill about 100 yards from the house, is an enclosed forty-foot square, strongly and securely fastened on all sides and reaching to the top is a wire sunk deeply into the ground to prevent the foxes burrowing their way out. This again is subdivided into six smaller enclosures where each pair are kept separately. The animals were very shy and only two foxes were seen. He was partly black and partly red. 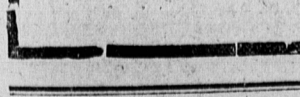
