Survivors from 10 Vessels land in Australia

CANBERRA, Jan. 2—(CP)—Survivors from 10 merchant vessels sunk by German warships in the Pacific disclosed today that passengers and crewmen of three vessels are still held captive by the raiders.

Vivid stories of the weeks that they also were prisoners came from 496 survivors—including 70 women and seven children—brought to Australia after they were marooned on December 21 on the lonely island of

INDIA'S ROADS

LONDON, Jan. 2—(CP)—W. Rees Jeffreys, British highway authority, wants the British and Indian governments to invite the United States government to finance and build an up-to-date highway system in India, the United States to receive in turn a 25-year monopoly on supplying India with road transport vehicles.

Putting his proposal in the November issue of "Roads and Road Construction," he said the United States held 75 per cent of the world's gold and if it remained unused it would be a "curse" so America should be invited to invest part of it in an Indian road system.

German Surface Raider Does A "Mussolini" When It Meets British Cruiser Berwick



The wolf was brave when it met sheep, but when it met a greyhound of the British navy it was a different story. Hit-and-run German surface raiders like the one shown (LEFT), can run harder than they can hit. Convoy like this (CENTRE) were the intended prey of the "powerful enemy surface raider," which took flight Christmas morning when it found the convoy it was to attack had a swift and hard-hitting guardian along with it. One ship of the convoy was damaged slightly before the enemy ship fled. Twice in a month has the 10,000-ton British cruiser Berwick (RIGHT) received the onsets of battle in contact with the enemy. She has been transferred from the Mediterranean service against Italy recently to convoy duty in the Atlantic. In a battle against Italian warships off Sardinia in late November, she was hit twice and lost seven men.
