The members of the Canadian Composite Artillery team which went to England last year and swept the field in the competitions on Salisbury Plains have each received from the Old Country a neat little booklet containing a record of the performance of the Canadian Team, the names of the team and a splendid reproduction of their photographs taken in London with "Fighting Bobs," Lord Roberts, sitting in their midst. In this picture can readily be recognized the familiar faces of Capt. D. MacKinnon, Q. M. S., Ernest A. Hearst, Sgt. Stanley Bagnall, City, and Sgt. Westaway, Georgetown. In the booklet are enumerated the four coast defence prizes and the six field and heavy artillery prizes all of which were captured by the Canucks, who took practically everything worth taking in the competition line.

The fourth regular meeting of the reorganized New London Literary Society was held recently in French River Hall with a large attendance of members and others. The entertainment for the evening was a program contest, the leaders being Miss Edna Delaney, French River, and Miss Stella Orr, Spring Brook. Quite a number took part on both sides giving those present the benefit of a rare musical and literary treat. Miss Orr was the winner. The Society has recently purchased a first-class phonograph and a lot of records, including all the latest songs. They also provide themselves on their fine library, which contains a large number of carefully selected books by the best authors. The entertainment for next night of meeting will be a debate "Which has the greater influence over man, the love of money or the love of women." Referring editorially to the future of Wallace an exchange says: If the Dominion Government will take steps to improve Wallace harbor and to assist in building a railway link connecting the town of Wallace with the main branch of the I. C. R., there seems to be no doubt but that the Dominion Coal Company will make this old Cumberland town the summer shipping port for coal destined to the St. Lawrence market. There is, however, another problem in connection with the future of Wallace which should be seriously considered by the people of Cumberland County, especially of Eastern Cumberland. At the present time, winter communications with Prince Edward Island and the mainland are kept up by ice breaking steamers running from Charlottetown to Pictou. During the past number of years many expert seamen have criticized the location of the winter route of travel between the island and the mainland. From Charlottetown to Wallace, if we mistake not, is less than half the distance between Charlottetown and Pictou and a number of men, who should be authorities on strait navigation during the winter season, contend that the difficulties with regard to the information between Wallace and Charlottetown is much less than between Charlottetown and Pictou. If this be so, Wallace would seem to be the natural port for communication with the mainland. We are not at all desirous of depriving Pictou of any of its trade but if it can be established that Wallace is the natural port for winter traffic, then trade should follow the lines of least resistance and Wallace should receive the benefit of its location and geographical advantages.

## FREEZING PLANT FOR NEW GRAND TRUNK HOTEL

In connection with the Chateau Laurier, the new \$2,000,000 Grand Trunk Hotel at Ottawa, it has been decided to establish an ice freezing plant, and the Forbes System of fertilization. This means that every drop of water that comes into the hotel for any purpose is first filtered twice, then sterilized and cooled, rendering it not only absolutely pure from all sanitary standpoints, but clear and free from any coloration.

As regards ice, the water from which it is made will be first filtered twice, then converted into steam, then condensed and frozen, rendering the ice not only absolutely pure but a beautiful clear transparent crystal.

## RUNAWAY TRAIN KILLS MANY.

SCRANTON, Pa., Dec. 13—By the running away of a freight train in the Carbondale yard of Delaware and Hudson Company five men were killed and five injured, two of whom will die.

The machine shops of the company were set on fire and burned, together with five locomotives.

OTTAWA, Dec. 13—After January 1st the inspection and testing of locomotives on all railroads under the jurisdiction of the Railway Commission will be governed on new and rigid rules, which the Board has issued to every road affected.

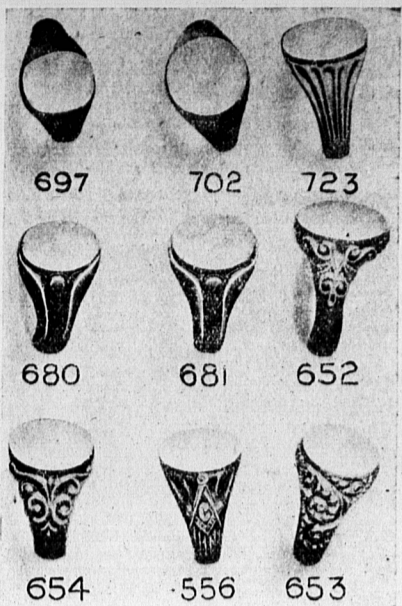

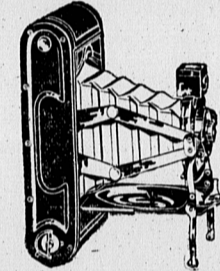
