CASCADES.—The Cascades, on return to Montreal, is due in Summerside at daylight this morning and will likely sail about 10 o'clock. Her outward cargo consists of about 1,000 bags oats, 200 lbs pork, all for Quebec, and a very large quantity of merchandise for the Gaspe Coast.

THE MORWENNA.—The Morwenna from Montreal, on her first trip this season, arrived in Summerside at 11 a. m. yesterday and sailed again about 4 p. m. for Charlotte town. She had no inward cargo. Owing to it not being intended to have her call at Summerside this trip, she only received the orders a few hours before sailing. Her outward cargo consisted of 200 bags oats, 400 bags potatoes, besides one cow and seven sheep.

QUEBEC CONSTABLE SHOT BY THIEVES

QUEBEC, April 29.—Provincial Police Constable Pierre Trudel was shot and mortally wounded at River Aux Pins, Val Carter, a distance of some 18 or 20 miles from Quebec last evening, and died at the peace of the Provincial Police left this morning for the scene of the trouble to take down the ante mortem statement of Trudel.

The shooting was supposedly done by a band of thieves who have since been arrested and are on their way to Quebec, where they will have to face a charge of a more serious crime.

REVOLUTIONISTS SECURED RELEASE OF PRISONERS

LISBON, Portugal, April 30.—Revolutionaries by a daring plan secured the release yesterday of a number of prisoners arrested during Sunday's political disturbances in the capital and confined on the Portuguese cruiser Republica, in the harbor. Several boats filled with armed men dressed as sailors clambered on board the cruiser at two o'clock in the morning and demanded that the prisoners be handed over to them. At the same moment three shots were fired from the guns on the cruiser for what reason has not been disclosed. The prisoners were then given up by their guards to the men who had boarded the warship, and it appeared as though the affair had been carried out with the connivance of some of the officers and crew.

The mother was engaged taking up carpets, the paper under which were carried to the kitchen. A little two-year-old child, unobserved, trust a paper into the front of the stove, the flames from which communicated to its clothing, which was soon a mass of flames, which were also inhaled. The mother hearing a strange noise rushed down stairs and in attempting to extinguish the flames was herself badly burned about the hands and arms. The child only lived a short time, passing away in convulsions.
