SOME ANCIENT RELICS

(London Chronicle) Discoveries of Roman and Saxon remains have resulted from a series of excavations at the Roman site of Lowbury, on the Berkshire Downs, 4 miles west of Goring-on-Thames. The excavations, which have been made upon a bare hill-top, 100 feet above sea level, have been carried out by means of a grant from University College, Reading.

A rectangular inclosure and several barrows have been unearthed, and 72 Roman coins, affording evidence of the second to nearly the end of the fourth century. Among these coins were three of Nerva, one of Trajan, one of Sabini, three of Antoninus and one of Marcus Aurelius. Another barrow yielded five denarii from Probus to Constantine, and some broken tiles and pottery. Other finds include six fibulae, a bronze signet ring, an iron dagger and spearhead.

The discovery of an undisturbed Saxon interment and skeleton in close connection with an area of Roman occupation is regarded as one of unusual interest and importance.

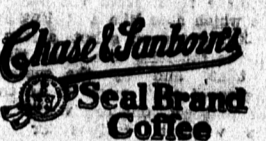

Dr. E. Linden Mellus, of Johns Hopkins university, has announced to all the world that your brain is good because it is, that's all. Whether your brain is the size of a crabapple, and as smooth, or the size of a cauliflower, and as convoluted, makes no difference in the mental punch. That's all due to some mysterious force, undiscovered and unanalyzed.

It is somewhat trying to have all the established notions kicked over to all the summary fashion, but maybe we can get used to this doctrine in the new year. Anyhow, there is some comfort in knowing that the rule-of-thumb method by which the world has been judging brain power for these many years—that of the quality of the product—does not conflict with the newest theory about the subject. So that while the text books may have to be rewritten the practice can go on as it is, and the size of the pay check still be the gauge of the brain punch.
