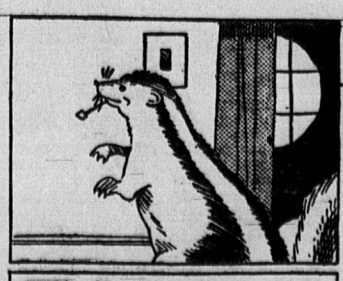
A VISIT TO SANTA CLAUS— More Magic and Mr. Skunk
