ARCHIBALD McLEOD REMANDED TO JAIL

Brought to the City Early Yesterday Morning By Sheriff and Taken Before Stipendiary Palmer—Preliminary Trial on Monday Morning.

Dominion of Canada, Province of Prince Edward Island, Queens County.

Before H. James Palmer, Esquire, Stipendiary Magistrate, For Queens County.

To all or any of the Constables and other Peace Officers in the said County of Queens:

Whereas Archibald McLeod of Rose Valley, Township number Sixty-seven in Queens County in said Island, farmer, has this day been charged upon oath before the undersigned H. James Palmer, Stipendiary Magistrate in and for the said County of Queens, for that he on the ninth day of April A. D. 1901 at Rose Valley, Lot Sixty seven aforesaid in the County of Queens, did kill and murder Isabella McLeod, contrary to the statute in such case made and provided:

These are therefore in His Majesty's name to command you forthwith to apprehend the said Archibald McLeod and to bring him before me or some other Justice of the Peace in and for the said County of Queens to answer unto the said charge and to be further dealt with according to law.

Given under my hand and seal this third day of May in the year one thousand nine hundred and one at Charlottetown in the County aforesaid.

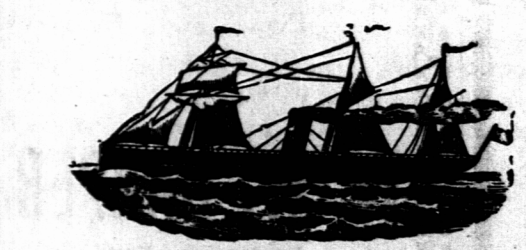
