**LONG COURSE.**—On Tuesday evening the students of the Long Course in Agriculture held their first debate. "Resolved that grade cows are as profitable as pure bred cows for the ordinary farmer." It was opened by Mr. Cyrus Poirier of Mt. Carmel and responded to by Mr. W. J. Cass of North River. Mr. Poirier simply outlined the Course which the debate should follow. Mr. Cass pointed out that it cost very little to establish a pure bred herd and that the difference in price of the calves in one season would more than offset the difference in cost of establishing a herd. Mr. T. Moore of St. Peter's supported Mr. Poirier. He pointed out that if the same feeding and care were given to good grade cattle, they should make a very much better showing than they do now, and that the ordinary farmer was not in a position to purchase pure bred cattle. Mr. Victor MacDonald in supporting the cost of pure bred cattle stated that the farmers will take more interest in pure bred cattle than they will in grades, and certainly do better with them. He pointed out that pure bred cattle would do much better than grades in milk production. Mr. Ramsey of Hamilton cited several cases where grade cattle had beaten pure bred at the tests and that our own grades had won the championship at the Toronto Show as Sweepstake beef animals. All of the students spoke. The debate was of high order and reflects much credit on the students. The subject for next night is: Resolved that "Country life is more conducive to happiness than City life."
