REDUCE SIZE OF LIMIT

The Fishermen's Union Asks That the 8 Inch Regulation Be Made 7.

HALIFAX, Sept. 7.—A very interesting discussion took place at the closing meeting of the Fishermen's Union in reference to several questions of vital interest to all fishermen.

"Resolved, that the government be asked to amend the size limit law for lobsters to suit the conditions existing with that fish peculiar to certain parts of the coast of Nova Scotia, and the Island of Cape Breton, viz. that the present 8 inch law as applied to the coast of the Island of Cape Breton, be reduced to 7 inches and the present 10 1/2 inches law as applied to the coast of Digby county be reduced to 9 inches, and that the 9 inch limit to apply to that part of the coast of Nova Scotia extending from Cape Sambre to the south west boundary of Annapolis county, and after the said law is adjusted and amended as above described, that the said above amended law be vigorously and honestly enforced. The following resolutions were adopted.

"Resolved that the regulations governing the spring herring fishery of Sydney river for bait for the prosecution of the fisheries be amended in as far as it refers to the time for the setting and taking up of nets, viz.—At present the law is nets to be set at 4 p.m. Monday and taken up at 10 a.m. Saturday to be changed to the setting of said nets to 4 a.m. Monday and the taking up at 8 p.m. Saturday and it further recommended that all barrels for the measuring of bait be inspected and stamped by an official of the marine and fisheries department.

"Resolved that the government be asked to appoint a fishery warden for Port Joli in order to protect our valuable lobster fishery which is now being depleted by an unscrupulously violated law, with power to inspect and brand all crates of live lobsters for shipment.

"Resolved, that the government be in reference to the case of the lobster season in Queens county be laid on the table.

It was resolved that Premier Murray be asked for an increase of \$300 as an appropriation for the fishery exhibition at Shelburne.

"Resolved that the government be asked to pass a law prohibiting the use of seines in shallow water, that are operated as a purse seine, by means of a method called tucking. This to not cover drag seines that

TWO MORE VESSELS WITH BIG CATCHES

HALIFAX, Sept. 7. Two more high liners of the LaHave fleet arrived in port yesterday from the banks en route to their home ports. They were the May Myrie, Captain Will Richardson, and Captain Kenney Silver. The Silver has been out six weeks and has 1,100 quintals. The May Myrie sailed for the banks two weeks before Captain Silver and has 1,350 quintals. Captain Silver, in conversation with The Herald yesterday afternoon said he left LaHave. He found fish very scarce and at last he was forced to abandon fishing and start for home. There are no fish now on Quere banks, said the captain. The remainder of the LaHave fleet was also getting ready for home.

ZEPPELIN TO FORM A COMPANY.

FRIEDRICHSHAFEN, Sept. 5.—Count Zeppelin today announced his intention to establish a company under the corporation act, to facilitate the administration of the funds contributed by the German people to aid him in the building of airships.

He appeared before the municipal council of Friedrichshafen and urged this body to offer such advantages as would result in retaining the plant for airship construction here. The fund contributed by the people does not exceed \$750,000.
