FORCED READING CONDEMNED BOOKS

MONTREAL, Dec. 16—The children's library was upheld as a safeguard against many undesirable attractions offered to children in Montreal, the "funnies" and the films had their place, the speaker declared, but the child brought up on these would never develop the type of personality fostered by the reading of properly selected books.

One of the most valuable features of the library system, Canon Shatford believed, was the voluntary character of the reading, which had a lasting effect.

Compulsory reading was soon forgotten. The reason many people disliked the Bible was they had been compelled to read it in childhood. "If you want to condemn a book," he added, "just compel a child to read it. I am satisfied that in the long run these libraries will have a greater effect on a child's life than anything he is obliged to do in day school."

Appeal Allowed By Supreme Court Canada

(C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) OTTAWA, Dec. 16—The Supreme Court of Canada has allowed with costs the appeal of the executors of Archibald Fraser, late of Edmonton, N. B., against a judgment in favor of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of New Brunswick. The Canadian Press reports yesterday that the appeal had been dismissed with costs. The Canadian Press reports the inaccuracy and any embarrassment it may have caused the executors.

The dispute between the executors and the New Brunswick treasury officials was as to the amount of the Fraser estate on which succession duties should be paid. The executors took the position that only about \$78,000 was liable and the department claimed duty on \$330,000.

Mr. Fraser left about \$400,000 of which a considerable portion was life insurance and also including a gift made before his death to his daughter. The estate had some \$23,000 in direct liabilities but during his life time Mr. Fraser had made large guarantees to companies in which he was largely interested as a shareholder.

The executors were Donald Fraser, Donald A. Fraser and Hon. R. B. Hanson.

Suffers Fit Of Yawning

(A. F. By Guardian's Special Wire) ROUND GROVE, Ill., Dec. 15—Suffering from exhaustion and hunger, Mrs. Harold McKee, farm housewife near here, passed the 100th hour mark tonight with a sign of relief from the uninterrupted attack of yawning with which she was seized Sunday.

Her physician and consultants from nearby towns declared the unusual case is similar to the more common spells of protracted hiccoughing and was probably induced, they said, by extreme nervous strain.

Hour after hour the yawns have followed, one as fast as that preceding is completed, at the rate of 10 to 12 a minute. It was estimated tonight the woman had yawned 50,000 times. Wild sedatives and exercises of will power failed to bring relief. Mrs. McKee cannot eat for when she tries to swallow the yawns choke her and even the administration of strong opiate has been only partially successful in inducing sleep.

The involuntary exercise of the women's throat has so fatigued her that the doctor doubts if she can stand the continued strain much longer. The attack came without warning, while Mrs. McKee apparently was in perfect health.

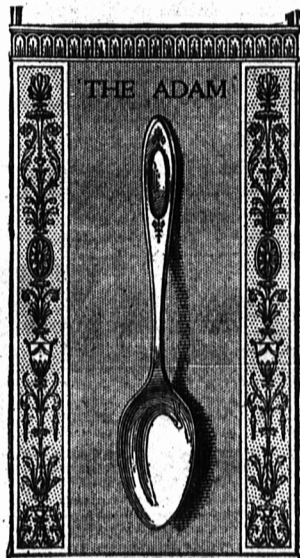
Prince Dons Horn-rimmed Spectacles

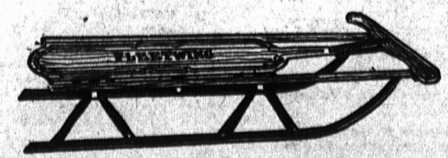
