(Special to the Guardian.) OTTAWA, June 23.—Announcement has been officially made of the temporary appointment of Col. J. W. Carson of the Grenadier Guards, Montreal, as Brigadier General. Lt. Col. G. S. Ryerson of Toronto has been granted the Honorary rank of Surgeon General. Lt. Col. W. E. Thompson of the 83rd Regt., Halifax Rifles, has been appointed Assistant Adjutant General in charge of the administration.

ALPINE TROOPS ATTACK AND DEFEAT AUSTRILIANS

ROME, via Paris, June 23.—The following statement was issued last night at the headquarters of the Italian general staff. "Enemy activity yesterday was confined to long range artillery fire at several points on the front. "In the Monte Nero zone one of our Alpine battalions encountered first enemy forces, recently arrived, probably from Galicia. The Alpine troops attacked and repulsed them inflicting heavy losses and taking some prisoners. "Night attacks by infantry were renewed against our positions at Plava with the most intense rifle fire and the use of hand grenades. All these attacks were repulsed. "On the lower Isonzo we further strengthened our occupation Floods caused by the enemy in the zone adjacent to the Monfalcone canal, although sensibly decreasing, still constitute a formidable obstacle. "An enemy aeroplane dropped several bombs without doing any damage. "CENEVA, June 22.—via Paris June 23.—A Tribune despatch from La Baich says: "The Italians have gained possession of all the positions dominating Malborghetto after a fierce struggle against the Austrians particularly Honved detachments which displayed great tenacity. PRINCE OF WALES WILL STAY AT FRONT

LONDON, June 22.—The Prince of Wales will attain his majority tomorrow. At the request of the King, there will be no public celebration of the event. The Prince will not come back to London for the occasion and the numerous addresses of congratulations, prepared by various civic and patriotic bodies, will be forwarded to him at the front.

SAYS HUSBAND TRIED TO POISON HER.

OWOSSO, Mich., June 22.—A hearing will be given Charles H. Miller, a real estate dealer, to-day, on the charge brought by his wife that he administered bichloride of mercury tablets to her with the intention of killing her. She charges that he substituted the poison tablets for medicine prescribed by the family physician. While ill a few weeks ago, Mrs. Miller telephoned to a physician, who put up some medicine which her husband delivered. One of the envelopes contained mercury tablets, three of which, taken at intervals, made her violently ill. Miller took the envelopes ostensibly to return them to the doctor. Mrs. Miller asserted, and delivered later to his wife three envelopes bearing the physician's label. One of the envelopes, the police stated, contained more of the poison tablets. The wife later found, in a pocket in her husband's coat, an ordinary envelope containing tablets. These she submitted to the family physician, who declared they were mercury tablets, which he never had nor ever prescribed. The accused husband insisted he delivered the medicine furnished by the physician and failed to account for the poison tablets in his pocket. The motive on which the police worked was that Miller and his wife have had trouble for a long time, she charging that he was frigidly with other women. The authorities have been trying to ascertain where Miller secured the tablets, and the result of their inquiry will be told at the hearing to-day, it is expected.

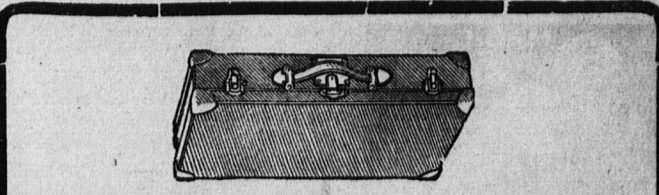
