HALIFAX, N. Will Enquire Into Pension Act

OTTAWA, April 25—(By The Canadian Press)—Establishment of a joint committee, one section of which will be appointed by the Government and the other by the Associated Veterans' Organizations, has been decided upon by the Government to enquire into the weakness of the present pension act and discover what amendments may be necessary thereto. This emerged yesterday from the conference between the Cabinet and representatives of the Associated Veterans.

Senate Reform

OTTAWA, April 25—(By The Canadian Press)—A Canadian Senate that would be a judicial body without respect for political party lines, and with a greatly reduced membership, was proposed in the House of Commons today by W. T. Lucas, (U. F. A., Camrose.) In view of recent disclosures by a Senate committee, and economic distress general throughout the country, Mr. Lucas was of the opinion that the time was ripe for "a real measure of Senate reform."

Will Visit Ottawa

OTTAWA, April 25—Immediately following the Imperial Economic Conference some 200 representatives of British manufacturers will visit Ottawa. L. E. Percival, assistant to the agent-general for Ontario at London, Eng., today conferred with H. K. Carruthers, secretary of the Board of Trade, with reference to the party's itinerary through Ontario.

No Such Resolution

OTTAWA, April 25—(By The Canadian Press)—"My information is that no such resolution has been received," said Hon. Robert Weir, Minister of Agriculture, in further reference today to a question asked by A. E. MacLean, (Lib., Prince.) last Friday, regarding receipt of a resolution from the Prince Edward Island Government asking for assistance in the purchase of fertilizer.

Appraisers To Value Rum Runners

NEW YORK, April 25—(By The Canadian Press)—Appraisers appointed by courts to set the sale price of vessels seized as rum runners may have been making extensively low appraisements and thus permitting the former owners, many of whom are Canadians, to repossess the craft at bargain prices and return them to the liquor trade, according to an announcement of the department of justice. The department's attention was called to the possibility when appraisements made by court appraisers fell from \$10,800 to \$36,000 short of customs officials' estimates.
