J. J. McKinnon, city, went to Georgetown on the mail special last evening.

During the severe storm of Saturday night a tall chimney on the house occupied by Mrs. T. L. Chapple, Prince Street, came down with a crash in the roof. The large chimney on the house of George Melnis, Cumberland Street, was also blown down.

Yesterday's train from Tignish to this city, due at one o'clock, had to contend with various obstacles on her journey and as a consequence she did not arrive here until four o'clock. Chief among the difficulties encountered were the handling of a heavy freight business and snow fighting. For this latter purpose there was a snow-plow attached and this necessitated slower progress. In places some quantity of snow was met with but was nothing unusual, considering the storm of Saturday.

Sunday evening in St. James' Church, Rev. T. F. Fullerton delivered an eloquent sermon on the subject "Burns' sermon and Songs." The text was "He that hath ears to hear, let him hear." In his masterly analysis of the character of the poet Mr. Fullerton pointed out that Burns showed to the world his weakness his strength, love, hate, glory and shame, but at the same time he set forth in his writings the fatherhood of God and the brotherhood of man, the dignity of labor, the joy of love and the sacredness of home. He was ever the advocate of the oppressed, was the apostle of independence at an age when caste was registered in the customs and laws of the state, but he was never independent of the love of his friends and of the love of God. Burns was deeply devout and carried his religion into his daily life. Recently many of the false views concerning him have been made right in the light of fuller knowledge. Mr. Fullerton read extracts from Burns' poems and prose writings, as illustrative of his discourse, which was marked throughout by deep earnestness and sincerity.

He was one of the brightest and most popular of the young men of this city and an evidence of his studious disposition and his ability for keen application to his work is shown in the marked success which attended his efforts in his chosen line of work. He was highly thought of among his school mates and the companions of his more mature years, all of whom will heartily regret his death at such an early age. Besides his father and mother he leaves to mourn two brothers, Reggie, in Vancouver, who was with his brother at his death, and Arthur, in Providence.
