

England Will Continue To Play Football

LONDON, Oct. 19—(CP Cable)—English and Scottish clubs resume competitive football Saturday in 10 regional centres. Regular league schedules were scrapped following the outbreak of war and since that time, teams have participated in exhibition matches.

The new competitions—eight in England and two in Scotland—will have 114 entrants out of the 126 clubs that make up the English and Scottish football leagues. Groups have been arranged generally on a geographical basis and without regard to the ranking of clubs prior to the war.

Aston Villa, Sunderland, Derby County, Exeter City, Ipswich Town and Gateshead are not participating in the English groups. Six teams of the Scottish league's second division will be dropped from the east and west leagues to play north of the border. They are Brechin City, East Stirlingshire, Edinburgh City, Forfar Athletic, Montrose and Leith Athletic or St. Bernards.

In English competition, western and northwest section will have 12 teams each, Northeast and East Midlands 11 each and Midland and south-west eight. The south has been divided into two sections—A and B—each with 10 teams.

Gene Tunney 'Shocked' By Lindbergh

BOSTON, Oct. 19—(CP)—Gene Tunney, former heavy-weight boxing champion, told the annual meeting of the associated industries of Massachusetts today that he was "shocked" at the "impertinence" of some of the declarations of Col. Charles Lindbergh in a recent broadcast, especially those concerning Canada.

(During the address Lindbergh declared for continuation of the American embargo on "offensive armaments," insisted "we must demand the freedom of the Continent," questioned if Canada "the right to draw this hemisphere into the European war because they prefer the Crown of England" and urged that the United States not dissipate its strength or go to the aid of Europe.)

Declaring he was personally acquainted with Lindbergh and had great respect for him, Tunney said he could not understand how Lindbergh, after being sheltered in England, could suddenly "dgerst" that country and make the proposals that he put forward.

North Atlantic Embargo Ban Would Be Retained

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19—(AP)—Proposed revisions of shipping restrictions in the United States Neutrality bill fail to apply to the North Atlantic and would continue the ban against intercoastal shipping between eastern ports and Canada.

Senators participating in the conference today of demagogic members of the foreign relations committee, who propounded the changes, explained they believed rail and inland waterways could be used instead of the maritime routes.

Senator Green (Democrat-Rhode Island), a member of the committee, said he did not believe there would be "much penalty involved, but sacrifices have to be made to restrict trade to avoid the possibility of war involvement."

A similar expression was made by Senator Austin (Republican-Vermont) who said he preferred to leave trade free from internal restrictions with the warning the United States would take no responsibility for it if trade with belligerents was involved or restricted zones were penetrated.

Some New England senators indicated privately they were concerned with the proposed raising of shipping bans on other oceans and seas and not the North Atlantic because of the tendency it might have to establish new trade routes which would penalize New England industry.

Other New Englanders expressed belief the restrictions would lead to a greater demand for carrying out the proposed St. Lawrence seaway.

and Rumania. Not only that, but the Dardanelles is the gateway to the Black Sea and provides the only sea route for all exports of Russian and Rumanian oil from the ports of Batum and Constanza.

3. It should have a steady effect on the whole Balkan bloc, effectively locking the valley of the Danube against military or economic penetration by Germany. Turkey has shown the way to her Balkan neighbors, given them courage to stand up against German demands at a time when they sorely needed such an example.

4. It should have a decided effect on Italian neutrality, because Italian intervention on the side of Germany would bring Turkey into the struggle automatically.

5. The British Government does not regard the pact as a blow to Russia, no matter how hard a blow to Germany it may be. It doesn't prevent Turkey and Russia from renewing negotiations for a complementary treaty, nor does it endanger the long friendship between the two nations.

In fact Britain would like to see Turkey and Russia come to amicable terms, because their agreement would form a diplomatic bridge between Britain and Russia—the enigma of Europe.

Treaty Into Effect

The treaty went into effect upon its signature tonight.

Under the terms of the treaty Britain and France must go to the assistance of Turkey:—

1. "In the event of an act of aggression is committed against Turkey by a European power."

2. "In the event of an act of aggression by a European power leading to war in the Mediterranean area in which Turkey is involved."

"Turkey agrees to go to the assistance of the western Allies:—

1. "In the event of an act of aggression by a European power leading to war in the Mediterranean area" in which Britain and France are involved.

2. "If the United Kingdom and France are engaged in hostilities in virtue of either of their guarantees to Greece and Rumania of April 13, 1939."

Those guarantees were to help Greece and Rumania against "ag-

gression" threatening their independence. They were given when Britain and France had sought to build a "front" of nations friendly to them after the German absorption of Czechoslovakia and the Italian occupation of Albania.

The House of Commons was in an expectant mood as Mr. Chamberlain asked permission to interrupt a minor argument on war prices and profiteering. Mr. Chamberlain started by telling of his announcement May 12 that Britain and Turkey had agreed to conclude a long term mutual assistance pact. Terms of the treaty itself, he said, were agreed on three weeks ago.

"But signature was postponed," he said, "as it was hoped by the Turkish Government that the visit of the Turkish minister of foreign affairs to Moscow might result in the conclusion between Turkey and the U. S. S. R. of a parallel treaty."

He told of "temporary suspension" of the Turkish-Russian talks because Turkey "felt that certain of the proposals which were made to them" could not be reconciled with points Britain, France and Turkey already had agreed on. He stressed that Turkey and Russia continued as friends. The Turkish Government, Mr.

Chamberlain read from his statement, had decided not to wait any longer. It looked up.

"I am glad to announce to the House," he said, "that the treaty was signed at Ankara (Ankara) half an hour ago."

He smiled, looking around the chamber, and the House thundered a cheer.
