Carmody, McNeill and Sutherland a comedy "Medical Examination" which brought down the house. The hall was tastefully decorated for the occasion and the whole entertainment heartily enjoyed both by the soldiers and by the quite large number of citizens present. The Nursing Sisters and the whole Home staff did everything possible to make the affair pleasant and they succeeded so well that the next entertainment is already looked for.
