A Voice From The Past

The following quotation from a speech made by the great Conservative statesman Disraeli in 1859, is recalled as a source of timely inspiration for us today.

"Remember always that England, though she is bound to Europe by tradition, by affection, by great similarity of habits, and all those ties which Time alone can create and consecrate, is not a mere Power of the Old World."

"We are bound to the communities of the New World, and those great States which our own planting and colonizing energies have created, by ties and interests which will sustain our power and enable us to play as great a part in the times yet to come as we do in these days, and as we have done in the past."

It is not, however, by way of having an absorbing and instructive hobby with which to while away the grim hours of Nazi occupation, but rather because postage stamps seem to the French to possess a more certain and more stable value than their national currency.

For the three months ending March, 1941, Canada imported from the United States \$12,955,339 of agricultural and vegetable products, and exported \$5,874,234.

Regret is expressed that more Americans are not finding their way to this Dominion. May is usually the month in which our American cousins begin in considerable number to wend their way north, but so far the trend has been comparatively insignificant.

The Australian War Cabinet has decided to appoint a general officer to command all military forces in Australia. The officer will have supreme command and disposition of all troops in Australia and strategy for the defense of the commonwealth.

The American-Scandinavian Foundation, of New York, has issued a bulletin, compiled from sources gathered by the Norwegian government in exile, which shows how bravely Norway is standing up to its oppressors.

The British Post Office has opened an "air-graph" letter service—the first of its kind—to speed delivery of letters from soldiers serving in the Middle East.

To imagine the sort of treatment U.S.A., would get from a victorious Germany let them examine the methods they use in dealing with Sweden, Switzerland, and other weaker countries.

Canada's tobacco industry has become an important contributor to the national income, the total value of manufactured tobacco products reaching \$90,600,000 in 1939.

"Roll Out The Bombers"

The President's insistence on a great speed-up in the production of heavy long-range bombers is particularly to be welcomed.

The reasons should by this time be clear to every one. Long-range bombers are the great need, whether the aid-to-Britain policy or of hemisphere defense or of defense of our own borders.

Similarly, long-range bombers are the first answer to our own hemisphere defense needs. They would necessarily be our first reliance for example, in the event of a surprise Axis attack in Central or South America or some equally remote point.

HOG PRODUCTION

Sir,—Concerning our hog production, I thought it only right to call the attention of our farmers to the fact that the Federal Government has increased the price of bacon one cent per pound and, in addition, the Provincial Government has provided ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to be paid to hog producers on the basis of fifty (50) cents per hog on A and B Grades.

"Roll Out The Bombers"

The Provincial Government has decided that they will not begin paying bonus until the first of June for the reason that the allotment of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) may not be sufficient to carry them over the whole year.

I wish to say to those interested that there is a dearth of sucker pigs in the province and there is a strong demand from the mainland for same. I know of one man who has an order from New Brunswick for one hundred (100) sucker pigs.

It seems to me that with a large quantity of grain in the province, it is an opportune time to go into the growing of hogs. There is a bigger thing behind this, farmers, than the money you will make, and that is in connection with the war.

England is asking for bacon and cheese and, emphasizing the need, I might call your attention to the fact that the British has asked Canada to supply seventeen million (17,000,000) lbs. of bacon in May over and above the regular allotment, and it is thought men it is apparent that the production of bacon and cheese is as essential to England in winning the war as is the production of ammunition. We have, therefore, no doubt as to the co-operation of our farmers and producers in measuring up to what is expected of them in assisting the mother country in her time of need.
