VANCOUVER WOMAN'S DEATH MYSTERIOUS

MOOSE JAW April 12.—World's Special Service.—The police have no clue to the identity of the woman who is alleged to have telephoned Mrs. Kent a few hours before her death, and the boy alleged to have delivered the parcel containing the poison has not responded to the offer of a reward. The facts collected point to the case being either one of murder or suicide. An inquest will be held on Thursday. The parents of the deceased are expected to arrive from their home in Vancouver today, and the funeral will be held immediately after their arrival.

Mrs. A. J. Kent was the wife of a prominent city merchant and died suddenly on Saturday evening. The deceased woman was visiting friends and appeared in the best of health when she expired suddenly. A parcel containing "medicine" was left at the Kent home shortly after the party phoned and mentioned having sent the medicine. After eating supper she took a quantity of the "medicine," which has since turned out to be gopher poison.

Mrs. Kent was well known in social circles. She was born at Gibson, N. B., 32 years ago, and was a daughter of J. and Mrs. Kyle. For some years before her marriage she lived in Vancouver. Three and a half years ago deceased was married to A. J. Kent, of Kent & Brown, merchants, here.

A BAD FIRE, MANY HOMELESS

ROCHESTER, April 14.—A fire which broke out in the Palmer Building, a four storey brick structure, devoted to manufacturing interests, was the starting point of a \$500,000 conflagration. The fire spread over a wide area, at one point jumping nearly a mile and starting a second series of fires—such a proportion that the local department was unable to cope with the situation. Aid was summoned from Buffalo and Syracuse, and both of these cities rushed companies to Rochester.

Hundreds of Rochester people have been made homeless and are camped out near the scenes of the fires with whatever property they were able to save from their homes. Over them the local Militia stand guard. There was no loss of life. Several firemen were injured by falling walls or overcome by the smoke, but none on Saturday and was drowned. (Mr. McInnis was well known in this city.)

PATIENT ACCIDENTALLY KILLED BY A NURSE

ST. LOUIS, Mo., April 13.—Miss Jennette Harkness, formerly of Toronto, a nurse in the city hospital, accidentally killed Benjamin Waters, a patient yesterday. Miss Harkness gave Waters a large dose of formaldehyde instead of a solution of salts, and the man died in an hour and a half. From the moment she discovered her mistake and called Superintendent Kirchner and his assistants, Miss Harkness worked heroically to save Waters. Then when physicians pronounced Waters dead she collapsed and became hysterical. The fatal mistake was made through another nurse misplacing bottles in the medical cabinet.

CAPTAIN MCINNIS DROWNED. MEAFORD, Ont., April 13.—Capt. John McInnis, owner of the fishing tug Primrose, of this town, while bringing his tug from Owen Sound where it had wintered, fell overboard or overcome by the smoke, but none on Saturday and was drowned. (Mr. McInnis was well known in this city.)

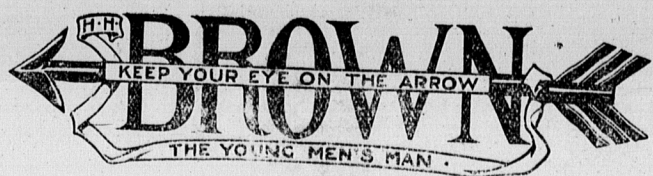

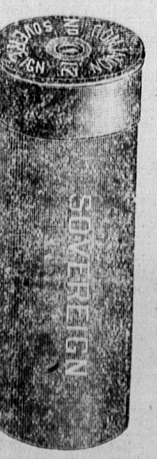
