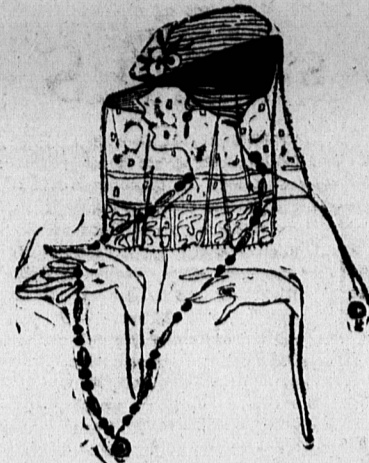

He had distinguished himself on the field for bravery, being decorated with a medal, and this later was supplemented with a bar. While his comrades would stand in awe at the daring of his exploits, he apparently did not flinch from the very dangerous task of relieving the wounded in the face of heavy firing.
