FISHERIES BOAT LOCATES NEW SCALLOP AREA

A very large and productive scallop area has been located off Annapolis harbor by the scallop boat being employed by the Prince Edward Island Fishermen's Loan Board.

The boat has been studying the grounds of the province to further the industry. Large scallop beds have been found in the waters surrounding the Island.

The captain of the vessel reported that he had obtained more than 500 scallops in two drags in the newly-found beds and that the shellfish were of a very fine quality.

This, with the area previously discovered off South Lake, should be sufficient to induce the fishermen of the eastern section of the province to undertake the development of the scallop industry at the earliest possible opportunity, it was believed.

The provincial loan board was established to loan the fishermen sufficient funds to pay an installment on the purchase of equipment, a trap hauler and a set of drags.

Inquiries have been received from Digby, N.S., regarding the productiveness of the Prince Edward Island scallop beds. That town has become the centre for a large scallop fishing fleet plying the waters of the Bay of Fundy.

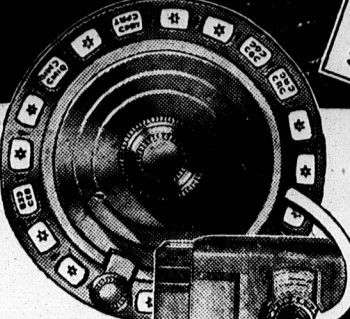
