WOMEN TRACTOR DRIVERS

Such a good response to the appeal in England for women to work tractors has been received that more will not be needed for some time, says a writer in the Christian Science Monitor. One hundred women have been chosen from among the candidates to form the first detachment, and they are to go out with their tractors soon. Preference has been given to candidates having a knowledge of machinery and running repairs, who have worked heavy machinery and have done general work on a farm. They are to be taught the use of the Ford tractor, which has the advantage of being lighter than those hitherto used. The life will entail much travelling about, and will call for endurance and adaptability on the part of the women. They are to be paid at the same rate as the men whose places they are taking. The news that the Food Production Department has gained permission from the Treasury to include a warm woolen jersey in the outfit of the women working on the land under the land army scheme, will be welcomed, since last winter, as no greatcoat was included in the Government outfit, the girls had to wear their own heavy coats.
