Strike In Cape Breton Will End On December 31

SYDNEY, N. S., Nov. 27.—By the terms of settlement negotiated by the British Empire Steel Corporation and representatives of the big four railway brotherhoods, the strike of the Cape Breton Steel Switchmen which has been in progress for over two years, will come to an end on December 31. The decision affects 134 locomotive engineers, firemen, brakemen and switchmen at Sydney and 43 men of similar trade in the Scotia yards at Sydney Mines. The settlement was negotiated at New Glasgow on November 22, exactly two years to a day from the time the walkout took place in 1920.

May Save Boy From Gallows

MONTREAL, Que., Nov. 27.—Some hope that the 18 year old youth, Garfield Tebo, who is under sentence of death in Digby county, N. S., may not go to the scaffold on Thursday next was yesterday inspired in the minds of several Montrealers who have moved in the matter of obtaining clemency. While it was anticipated that the case is now before the cabinet and that no decision had been announced as yet, a hint was given by Mr. Robert Bickerdyk, president of the Canadian prisoners' welfare, that there was no need to arrange a proposed deputation to the minister of justice. The association had sent a petition to the department this week and was proposing to follow it up by a deputation for which support of several city ministers, social workers and medical men had been provisionally promised.

Cabinet Of Greece Throws Up Its Task

ATHENS, Nov. 27.—The Greek Cabinet has resigned. The political situation is extremely complicated. The military authorities are taking an uncompromising attitude regarding the former ministers who are on trial charged with treason.

Since the defeat of the Greeks by the Turks there has been more or less desension in Greece, with the republicans and monarchists seeking supremacy. The revolutionary committee which has been in charge of the situation since the overthrow of King Constantine has ruled with a strong hand. In addition to proclaiming martial law, it has brought to trial a number of prominent personages charged with treason in connection with the defeat of the Greeks. The present Cabinet was formed in September 30 with Alexandros Zaimis as Premier.

SOLDIER JONES TAKES ON CHAS. WELFORD

LONDON, Nov. 28.—"Soldier" Jones, the Canadian puglist, has been matched against the New castle cruiserweight fighter, Charlie Welford, for a 20 round bout at catchweights for £2,100 a side and a purse. The fight is to take place at Newtsale, South Shields or Well End, in January.

Minister Of Immigration Appeals For Finances

MONTREAL, Nov. 27.—Canada's financial interests were appealed to today to assume a share of the burden of carrying out the federal government's immigration policy by Hon. Charles Stewart, Minister of the Interior and acting Minister of Immigration, speaking at the Canadian Club here today. Two outstanding new features were traced by the Minister in the new program. First, the western states will be combed and made the target of an intensive advertising campaign to attract tenants, farmers, or renters who are paying exorbitant rentals for farms. Most of these farms were bought at a high price, and are now at commanding rents from seven to ten times more than are paid in Western Canada.

Second, a similar intensive publicity campaign will be conducted throughout Great Britain and certain of the northern states of Europe to attract the most desirable type of settlers, while an especial effort will be made to bring cure immigrants with them to establish themselves on the land. A plan similar to that decided upon for the United States will also be followed, that is tenant farmers will be sought, to further aid in a better development of land already available for cultivation; an appeal will be made to the larger western land owners to release a portion of their holdings to tenants on a crop payment or other co-operative basis.

Bandits Kidnap U. S. Mail Driver

CHICAGO, Nov. 27.—Mail bandits kidnaped the driver of a truck carrying 450 pounds of first class mail for the Omaha post office in the west side "Bad Lands" early today, dumped him into the street seven miles north and then disappeared with the truck and pouches. Four hours after the robbery the truck was abandoned at 16th and Wood streets. The sixteen mail sacks were gone. Experts from the bureau of identification were called to try to find finger prints on the truck body. It was the first mail robbery in Chicago since the spectacular station robberies of nearly two years ago, following which the government posted marines to guard the mails.

The alarm was given by the abducted chauffeur, William Hogan who telephoned from a garage near where he was set afoot, at Southport avenue and Roccoe St. Postal inspectors and police squads hurried to pick up the bandits' trail. Hogan said the robbers, four or five of them, riding in a touring car, overtook him at Jackson boulevard and Rockwell street, while he was driving from the main postoffice to the air mail field in Maywood. His cargo of pouches was to have been delivered to the pilot of the Omaha mail plane.

After overpowering him, Hogan said, the highwaymen threw him face downward in their car. They took the key to the screened cage of the mail truck, two or three of the band boarded the truck and the two cars were driven north.

The postal authorities tonight offered rewards totalling \$12,000 for information leading to the arrest of the bandits. Although the men stole 16 bags, containing about 450 pounds of mail, a check up completed by postal inspectors revealed that the robbers are lucky if they got enough money to pay for the gas used in their bandit car.

According to A. E. Gerner, postal inspector in charge at the Federal building, the robbery was committed by a "crow of cheap stick-up men."

WASHINGTON ISSUES RULES FOR THE EXPORT OF LIQUOR

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28.—Rules governing the export of liquor to Canada were issued today by Prohibition Commissioner Haynes. Where Canadian provinces permit the importation of liquor for beverage purposes, they state, notice is to be given at once to the liquor law enforcement officer of the province to which the shipment is extended, giving the names of the exporters and the foreign consigner, the kind and quantity of the liquor, the proposed route of shipment, the proposed port of exit from the United States, the port of entry into Canada and the Canadian carrier.

Boy Sawn In Two In A Sawmill Near Hampton

ST. JOHN, Nov. 27.—William Ingram, 15, was killed in a sawmill on Saturday near Hampton, Kings County, when he was caught in the machinery and his body was sawn in two. The lad was employed in the mill and when aiding in feeding the saw, his hand became caught in the carriage.

Irish Girls Jailed For Derisive Signs

DUBLIN, Nov. 27.—The practice of young women followers of Eamonn De Valera's party of going out in the early morning and painting upon or cutting into the walls of government buildings remarks not complimentary to the government has been checked by a city magistrate who has sent two of the culprits to jail for seven days.

For months the walls surrounding the grounds of staid old Trinity College have been emblazoned with green, red, black and white signs informing the public that dark deeds were being done by the members of the government and that darker fates were awaiting them.

A police raid surprised twelve girls painting a wall along the Liffey embankment and two were caught. Before the Magistrate they said: "We are members of the Irish Republic, and we don't recognize this court." "But I recognize you, and that's more important," replied His Worship, as he gave them the alternative of putting up five pounds bail to keep the peace or seven days in prison. The girls chose jail.

Czarists Met In Secret In Paris

PARIS, Nov. 27.—The Supreme Council of Russian Monarchists representing all that is left of the movement in favor of the return of Czarism in Russia, has just completed a five day secret session in Paris during which Grand Duke Nicholas, former commander in chief of the Russian army, was

The council was held sooner than expected because of the recent announcement by Grand Duke Cyril that he was the logical heir to the Romanoff throne.

Cyril and Dimitri were considered for the honor by the council, but Nicholas received 55 of the 60 votes. Alexander Trepoff was
