EARL HERMAN.—The death under unusually sad circumstances of Earl Herman, aged eighteen, eldest son of the late Mr. John P. Herman, and grandson of Mr. and Mrs. George Carver of Pownal, occurred Tuesday. Earl went out alone shooting in Pownal Bay about 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. At 5 o'clock his body was found in the boat, which was half full of water, and which had drifted ashore, on the other side of the bay. He was bruised about the face, and the theory is that he had taken a weak turn and fallen in the boat sustaining fatal injuries. The late Earl Herman was a young man of fine physique. He has taken part in athletic contests, winning the shot putting events. He possessed admirable qualities of mind and heart, was of very friendly disposition and made many warm friends who will learn with great sorrow of his untimely death. When just on the threshold of manhood, he leaves to mourn besides his widowed mother, one sister, Lona, and three brothers, Louis and Jack at Pownal and Roy in Halifax. The funeral will be held at Pownal today at 2 p. m.

Sugar War Probed

WILMINGTON, N. C., Nov. 24.—The yacht Mosquito, a 50-foot craft owned by D. B. Roberts, of Hartford, Conn., sunk in five feet of water, in Frying Pan Shoals Saturday night, and was broken up by choppy seas. The captain and his one assistant were taken off by a row from Cape Fear Regard station.

To Remove Wreck

MONTREAL, Nov. 24.—Arrangements have been made to have the wreck of the Canadian Recruit, which lies in the Traverse, about 25 miles below Quebec, removed as soon as possible after the opening of navigation next year. The action is the result of recommendations made by Captain L. A. Demers, Dominion Wreck Commissioner.

These recipes are taken from the old household "Scrap Book" started by Queen Victoria in 1831. To this book various members of the Royal Family have contributed directions for the preparation of their favorite dishes. Contrary to general belief, the meals of the British Royal Family are not elaborate. The recipes can be utilized by any Canadian housewife.

SOUPS

LORD WILLIS WHITE SOUP.

Boil a knuckle of veal and 3 lbs. of mutton, or an old fowl with 3 lbs. of mutton in 5 quarts of water. Add 2 spoonfuls of rice, 1 onion with 3 or 4 cloves stuck in it, a blade or two of mace, and a few peppercorns. Boil very gently for 3 hours, then strain it off and add 2 ozs. of vermicelli and a head of young celery cut small. Boil for 1/4 hour, stirring it all the while. Cut a handful of spinach not too finely, boil it up fast, then stir in 5 spoonfuls of cream. Toast a piece of bread and butter it. Put it in broth and serve it up.

KING GEORGE'S MUTTON CUTLETS

STOCK MARKET

(Canadian Press.) MONTREAL, Nov. 25.—Dominion live stock report. With but 95 cattle, 42 sheep and lambs, 151 hogs, and 12 calves, for sale on the two markets this morning, trading was very slow. The cattle offering was made up at most entirely of canner cows and common bulls, and the bulk were left over from yesterday. Canners sold from \$2 to \$2.15, cutters \$2.50 to \$2.75, and bulls from \$3 to \$3.50 for the bulk. Calves were hard to sell at common and medium suckers were quoted from \$9 to \$10. Hogs were lower. Several leads were received yesterday afternoon and prices dropped 25 cents on all grades. Sales yesterday afternoon were made at \$12.75 for mixed lots, \$12.25 for select and \$10 for coveys, and trading today was very slow with a weaker undertone. Very few hogs were sold this morning.

4 Women Are Slugged In Week

TOLEDO, Ohio, Nov. 23.—Another woman was slugged here last night for the fourth this week, and the seventh since last May, while hundreds of police officers, assisted by scores of railroad detectives and civilians, conducted one of the most sweeping man hunts in the history of Toledo.

Two of the attacks resulted in the death of the women, and a check today, showed the other five victims in serious condition from shock and injuries.

Last night's attack was like the preceding ones. The clubber leaped at his victim, Mrs. J. G. Knight, 26, from behind a tree, and crushed her with his weapon across her head before she had time to scream for help.

NEW YORK, Nov. 24.—Suit to recover \$45,578,000 from the Russian Soviet Government, was filed in Supreme Court today by an Attorney representing the Usetico Inc., a New York Corporation. The corporation as assignee of Sophy Kapnist, Marie Karpoff and Vera Karpoff Pesteroff alleges that the three women on December 5, 1919, were deprived by the Soviet Government of gold rubles, jewelry, a bond and property to the value named in the suit.

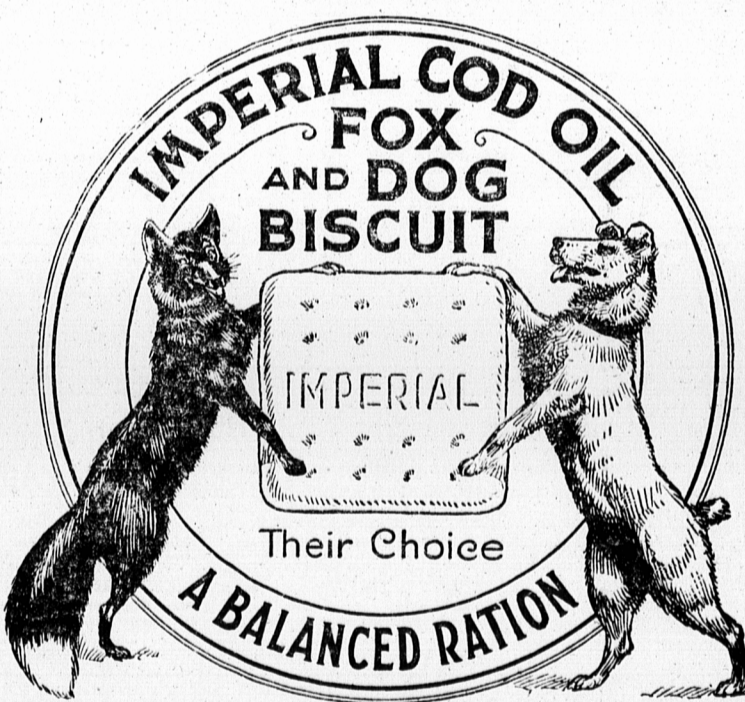
