The schooner Kilkeel arrived last night with a cargo of Inverness round coal for A. Pickard & Co, City.

Splendid progress is being made in the regular practice for the big concert by the Charlottetown Male Chorus, under the auspices of the 4th Regiment Artillery, which will be given in the Opera House, Tuesday evening, Dec 14th.

The services in York Church by Evangelist McKay Sunday morning and evening last will not soon be forgotten. The addresses were forceful, most inspiring and most eloquently delivered. Those who have not heard Mr McKay will do well to attend the special meetings which are to be continued all this week at 7.30 o'clock each evening.

The S. S. Cacouna will be due here this morning from Sydney, C. B., with a cargo of 2,200 tons of reserve running coal for Peak Bros & Co. This cargo has been specially ordered for domestic and steam purposes and to meet their retail trade during the winter months. Parties requiring coal are asked to kindly send in their orders at once and the coal will be delivered while steamer is discharging.

At the Police Court in this City yesterday morning the prohibition case against A. Kenny, was further adjourned until Thursday morning next. Two drunks, W. Power and W. Kiggins were fined \$20 or sixty days and \$2 or ten days respectively. The first named took the days. H. Weeks, James Stewart and W. P. Deull, for neglecting to comply with the regulations of the city bye-law respecting removal of snow from the sidewalks were each fined two dollars.

It will be good news to the people of this Province, who ship smelts to U. S. markets, to know that the duty on same when "fresh" or "frozen" has been lowered to but three quarters of a cent per pound, and thus all such should always be billed as "frozen" whether shipped in small or large quantities. Smelts which are packed in ice are regarded as "preserved" rather than "fresh" or "frozen", and when thus shipped in packages of less than one hundred pounds the duty is thirty per cent ad valorem. The above reduction is the result of the efforts of a committee of which J. A. Rich of J. A. Rich & Co, Boston, was a member being chosen by the Wholesale Commission Fish Dealers of that city.
