Continued From Page One. conversation with Mrs. Ellis where in the deceased spoke of ill treatment by her husband. She was frightened that "her blood would be on her husband's hand" and that she "didn't want to go home to be killed."

Mr. Saunders testified that Mrs. Ellis said she was in a certain condition. Mrs. Charles Ramsay who at the time of the tragedy lived to the east of the prisoner's home was the next witness. He told of a property deal with the prisoner through the Soldiers' Settlement Board on the morning of Jan. 6. The witness, his wife and the prisoner went into Summerside to conclude the arrangement.

Mr. Johnston asked the witness about his opinion as to the possibility of a person using the scissors to cut the carotid after using a razor. "It would be possible but very improbable," replied Dr. McTaggart.

Major George Brammitt, brother of the deceased, residing in Toronto and who is lecturer at the Toronto University, was the next witness for the prosecution. Witness stated that his father, Thomas Brammitt was a superintendent of the dist. Minister, living at Worthing, England. There were five in the family, the deceased being third.

Mrs. Lillian Doyle employed at the Summerside Railway Station testified that she remembered Jan. 6 last. She recognized a photograph of Mrs. Ellis as that of a woman who was sitting on one of the seats of the waiting room at about 5.30 p. m. She was crying. Witness said she saw wounds on the woman's left arm.

Dr. McTaggart testified that he had examined the body of the deceased and that he had identified the witness. "I wish I were dead," he said. "If there were a hole in the ice out there I would jump in."
