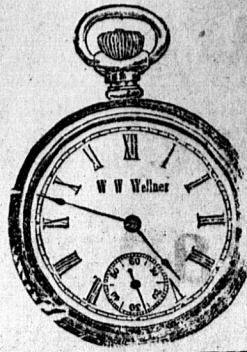

GEORGE IRVING, the International College Secretary of the Young Men's Christian Association for Canada, addressed the Methodist Conference at Montreal pointing out the strategic value of the college education. Speaking of the work of the Y.M.C.A. he referred to the valuable evangelistic agency in the Bible study classes, in which last year some 40,000 students were united. ALTHOUGH no Island horses took part in the races at Halifax on Wednesday, the news of the contests as reported in The Guardian yesterday was read with interest by horsemen here. The Halifax Herald speaking of the 2,100 race, says:—A perfect day, a fast track, a record attendance and the favorites won. This was the bill of fare at the exhibition track yesterday. The races, while very interesting and trodden in record time, lacked the stirring finishes of the preceding day. Kingsborough won the 2,40 stake in straight heats in full fly as fast time as the thirty class of yesterday. After losing the first heat to R. A. M., Estell Boy won the next three heats, and the race, making a new trotting record of 2:17 for the track and clipping a second and a half off her own record. There was entirely too much scoring in both races, due to the drivers on the outside failing to keep behind the pole horse. Started Power, after showing a lot of patience, finished Oax, Bouffier and Carroll five dollars each.

### STENSLAND PUT BEHIND THE BARS

CHICAGO, Sept. 26.—Paul O. Stensland, to whose confessed embezzlement of \$400,000 was due chiefly the collapse of the Milwaukee Avenue State Bank, of which he was president, today was sentenced in record time to serve from one to ten years in the penitentiary. Within three hours after Stensland's arrival in Chicago today from Morocco, whither he fled before the bank failed, the former bank president pleaded guilty before Judge Kerster and received sentence. Before another three hours had elapsed he had begun service of the sentence at Joliet prison.

Stensland pleaded guilty on two indictments, charging embezzlement and violation of the state banking laws. A fine of \$120 was imposed on the latter charge, which was based upon the acceptance of \$90 in deposits after the bank was insolvent. The prison sentence imposed, which will operate concurrently, are from one to five and from one to three years, making the longest term possible ten years.

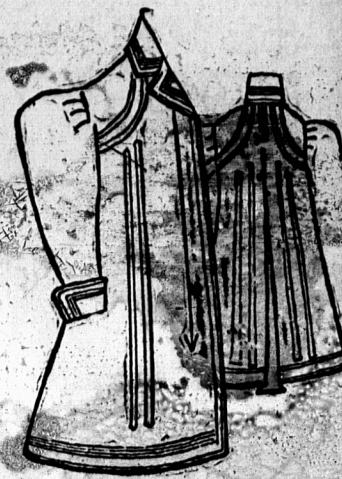
