MEETING OF THE PRESBYTERY

Meeting Held at Belfast-- Rev. S.D. McPhee Inducted into Pastoral Charge of Belfast.

At Belfast, and within the Presbyterian Church there, on Tuesday, Nov. 27th, 1906, and at 11 o'clock forenoon, the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met pursuant to adjournment and was constituted: Mr. T.F. Fullerton moderator pro tempore, with whom were present Messrs A. Gray, R. S. Sinclair, S. D. McPhee, W. H. Spencer, A. Craiss, ministers; and John McDonald, elder.

Rev. H. Michael was invited to sit and correspond. The edict for the induction of Mr. S. D. McPhee having been returned as only served, proclamation was read before the assembled congregation, and no objection being offered to the life or doc rine of Mr. McPhee, Mr. A. Gray conducted divine service, preaching from

Acts 2: 16-19; the moderator narrated the steps and put the usual questions, which being satisfactorily answered Mr. S. D. McPhee was by prayer inducted into the pastoral charge of Belfast congregation and received the right hand of fellowship from the members of Presbytery. Mr. R. G. Sinclair addressed the newly inducted minister and Mr. W. H. Spencer the people on their respective duties. After conferring with the elders and trustees of the congregation Presbytery adjourned to meet in St. Andrew's Church, Orwell, at 2:30 o'clock afternoon, of which public intimation was made, and this adjournment was closed with the benediction.

At Orwell, and within St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church there, on Tuesday, Nov. 27th, 1906, and at 2:30 o'clock afternoon, the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met pursuant to adjournment and was constituted: Mr. T.F. Fullerton moderator pro tempore, with whom were present Messrs A. Gray, R. G. Sinclair, S. D. McPhee, W. H. Spencer, A. Craiss, ministers and John A. McQueen, John McDonald, and D. J. Campbell, elders.

The edict for the ordination of Mr. Hugh Michael having been returned as duly served Mr. S. D. McPhee conducted public worship, preaching from Romans 1:16. Thereafter the moderator put the usual questions to Mr. Michael, which being satisfactorily answered he was by prayer and the laying on the hands of the Presbytery ordained to the office of the Holy Ministry. Having signified his willingness to sign the formula Mr. Michael's name was placed on the appendix to the roll of Presbytery. Mr. R. G. Sinclair addressed the newly ordained minister in fitting terms. Presbytery considered the resignation of Mr. R. G. Sinclair of the pastoral charge of Montague, Messrs D. L. McKinnon, D. J. Campbell and John J. McDonald appeared as commissioners from Montague and presented resolutions from session and congregation expressing regret at Mr. Sinclair's action and the strong desire that he withdraw his resignation. On motion, and with the consent of Mr. Sinclair it was decided that the resignation be further laid on the table until the March meeting of Presbytery.

The clerk stated that under new regulations for the management of the Synod Fund the sum of \$285 had been allocated by Synod to this Presbytery. Accordingly Messrs W. H. Spencer and T. C. James were appointed to prepare a scheme of allocations to congregations and submit the same at next meeting. On motion the following augmentation allocations were made: Martlet and West River \$18 each; West Cape, Richmond Bay East, Tignish, Bloomfield, Bonshaw, Mt. Stewart, Dundas, Murray Harbor North, Murray Harbor South, Woodville, Caledonia \$32 each; St. Peter's, Georgetown, Covehead, Orwell, Richmond Bay West \$35 each; Carleton, Alberton \$42 each; Cavendish, Brookfield, Strathalbyn, Montague, Souris \$45 each; Clifton, Valleyfield, Bedouque \$51 each; Kensington, Belfast \$68 each; Malpeque \$80; Summerside, Zion, Charlottetown, St. James' Charlottetown, \$88 each.

It was moved seconded, and carried that the clerk be instructed to apply to the Home Mission Committee for a grant of \$100 for hospital work in Charlottetown. After consultation with the elders and trustees of Orwell congregation Presbytery adjourned to meet in Zion church Charlottetown on Thursday the 13th day of December next at 7:30 p. m., of which public intimation was made, and this adjournment was closed with the benediction.

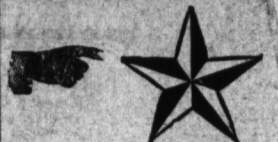
