MONTREAL, April 11 - (CP) -
A two-day convention to reorgan-
ize the Progressive Conservative
party in Quebec province ended
today with a luncheon at which
John Brackley, National leader of
the Party, called for "strong men"
to come forward from French-
speaking Canada to represent the
pioneer white race on this con-
tinent.
Approximately 300 delegates from
many parts of the province at-
tended the convention at which
John Brackley, National leader of
the Party in Quebec as head of a new-
ly-created 15-man executive coun-
cil.
George Morin of Montreal was
named secretary of the council.
The various members represent
various provincial districts. The
executive council will meet four times
annually.
As leader of this party what
I want to see is strong men come
forward from French-speaking
Canada to represent the pioneer
white race of this continent. Give
us a representative of every oc-
cupational, religious and cultural
group. Give us that, and let us to-
gether build, on the northern half
of this continent, a nation that will

Atomic Power Dependent On World Control

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J., April 11
- (AP) - Dr. Glenn T. Seaborg,
co-discoverer of plutonium, said to-
day that unless effective interna-
tional control of atomic energy
were established "an alternative lies
in foregoing the commercial use of
this source of energy."
Such an alternative was a "solu-
tion which it seems a pity to be
forced to accept," the University of
Chicago scientists told the Ameri-
can Chemical Society in an address
prepared for a symposium of nuclear
energy.
"Atomic energy will be used in
industrial peacetime applications
because of the advantages which it
affords, and therefore it will be
necessary to solve this problem of
control" politically in the interna-
tional front. The solution probably
lies in the development of an in-
ternational control system based
upon inspection to prevent the diver-
sion of the material to illegal
purposes."
Dr. Seaborg was one of a group
of atomic scientists who yesterday
released a statement in Washing-
ton declaring that "denaturing" of
atomic materials of itself cannot
eliminate the dangers of atomic
warfare.
In a report to the same symposium,
Dr. Milton Burton, who was
associated with Oak Ridge atomic
project, said chemists may be
able to change the properties of
familiar solids as well as a result
of techniques discovered in the

SYDNEY, Australia, April 11 -
Prime Minister Chifley has es-
tablished that "the pipe is the social
equal of the cigarette, cheroot and
cigar," said a columnist yesterday
in the Sydney Sun.
The columnist said an associate
of Mr. Chifley was reproved by
a member of the staff of the
Duke of Gloucester, Governor-Gen-
eral, for smoking a pipe at a gov-
ernment function.
He added that the Prime Min-
ister subsequently spoke to the
Duke about it and "it now is be-
cause of an Australian who
smokes his pipe anywhere, once it
has been announced that gen-
tlemen may smoke."
