SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON XI. SEPTEMBER 15.

JUDGEMENT AND MERCY.

Matt. 11: 2-30.

GOLDEN TEXT.

"Come unto Me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."—Matt. 11: 28.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

If this lesson appears difficult, do not aggravate the situation by endeavor to get at its teaching by sheer brain-sweat. The key to its interpretation will rather be found through the affectional.

It will be profitable to let the heart-key find what it can discover in verses 25-27 in the lesson before attempting to unlock the apparently forbidding and judgment like bolts of verses 20-24.

Have not verses 25-27 a close companion in what Jesus has said elsewhere, namely, "Except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall in no wise enter into the kingdom of heaven"? Spiritual insight, it must be learned, can only be given to fresh, frank, tender simplicity.

The worldly-wise and the pharisaically self-sufficient must measure down to that foundational law of moral greatness and spiritual power, or fall in the very things upon which they plume their pride.

The will of Jesus to admit into the secrets and mysteries of the Kingdom the simple, open-hearted and teachable of necessity cuts the other way and excludes the spurious and self-vaunting and sneeringly unresponsive. But they may resist ten-fold more temptation than another before he makes shipwreck like the going down of the Titanic, while the sin of the other is insidious, constant, and scarcely discoverable until the flash of the judgment day. Better let Almighty God decide between Chorazin and Sidon, Bethsaida and Tyre, Capernaum and Sodom.

Thus the "wise and prudent" of the cities of Galilee brought judgement upon themselves. They were blinded to their opportunity and were deprived of the blessings of discipleship through their unteachableness and that self-conceit which, while curious, is proudly and, sometimes, offensively, non-committal.

When one would compare the merits or demerits of cities one with another he must keep in mind what he must also do in comparing the goodness or badness of one man with another. It is quite possible that one man may resist ten-fold more temptation than another before he makes shipwreck like the going down of the Titanic, while the sin of the other is insidious, constant, and scarcely discoverable until the flash of the judgment day. Better let Almighty God decide between Chorazin and Sidon, Bethsaida and Tyre, Capernaum and Sodom.

"Take note of the great things which are revealed to "babes," and pray for the simplicity of spiritual understanding which will make them to you like truths which are "felt." For example, what is the impress upon soul which is made by the fact that the Father gave all authority to Jesus? For what ends was that authority given? Can you test it by your own experience? Whereby is your assurance that your experience tests it?

The precious invitation, the urgent exhortation and the sure promises of verses 28-30 are full of the plan and power of the gospel. The verses are as sweet as bird-songs and fresh as the waters from a mountain spring.

But better than any rhetoric about them is the going about it to adjust the yoke of Jesus to the burdened heart. One thing is certain—the yoke of sin is so galling it ought to be thrown away.

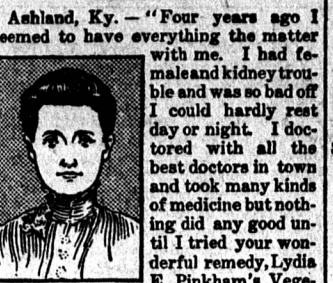

Workers cannot always secure what they frequently very much need and what the Master is willing to provide, namely, retirement and rest. The fellow who is a Christian worker in quiet, restful places is desirable. But where the unsheltered press them the greater need is at hand and rest must give way to duty.

Possibly there is no sight so compellingly pitiful as that which is furnished by the eager, anxious throng, the hand-to-mouth throng; physically hungry, mentally unquipped, spiritually groping as blind men grope for the wall. What sicknesses, what sorrows, what heartaches, what tragedies! And all the corners of the earth can produce them.

And no eyes light on the moving multitude so quickly as those of Jesus. And never is there a time when He does not do the very best He can for them. Philistine financiers would turn them adrift as too big a proposition, but the world's great Friend never does. The great trouble is that the throng is more in search of benefits for the body than for the soul. Thus it comes to pass that while the sympathizing Jesus does the best He can. He so often cannot do what he would.

Where the Master makes request that He may use of what we have it is not for us to interrogate the wisdom of His request. Rather let our joy be made full by witnessing how our little becomes much in His wonder-working hands. There would be no hungry millions if Jesus Christ were given the right of way to the granaries or if church members believed that they were only stewards.

Such a master of assemblies as Jesus shows us the value of system and order in His generalship. Some think that He bade the multitude to be seated in ranks and companies to shut off the chances of the "picnic glutton." Rather does not His action suggest His abhorrence of the pell-mell and confusion of too many sacramental occasions? Orderliness in any public function is fundamental.

"He blessed, and brake the loaves." The example of Jesus in the matter of "grace before meat" is so clear that a failure in it upon the part of a disciple is without warrant or excuse.

The gifts of God are never niggardly. Enough for all, enough for each. There is always fulness in the blessings of the Gospel of Christ. The Lord gives according to His ability, which is to do exceeding abundantly about all that we ask or think.

But there must not be made a waste of His blessings. There must be economy in management where is plentifulness in the resources. The split of Christendom into denominations means wastefulness of the resources of the Kingdom of God that be remedied. Or are they feeding from the overplus of baskets. The narrative does not tell whether they were carried or where used.

In the application of this lesson do not fail to include the fact which Jesus makes of first importance, namely, that He is the living bread—the bread sent down from heaven.
