THE GROWTH OF CITIES.

Of the half million souls added to the population of Canada 177,377, or more than one third of the total gain, was in twenty cities of the Dominion. A fourth part and more of this gain—49,645—in the cities was in the Canadian metropolis; Montreal. Toronto gained 26,751; Winnipeg gained 16,697; Ottawa 15,748; Vancouver 12,487; Calgary 8,266; Sydney 7,481, and other towns added from 5,000 or less down to Charlottetown whose gain was 707. Of the Maritime cities other than those named the gains were small Moncton, 3,861; Halifax 2,292 and St. John 1,532.

So far the growth of cities in the centre and west of the Dominion may be said to have been fairly satisfactory had there been a concurrent gain in the country districts. This there has not been. Slow as has been the growth of cities in the Maritime Provinces the growth of population in the rural districts has been slower still and in too many cases there has been an actual decline. This is unfortunately true of the three counties of Prince Edward Island. The counties of Albert, Carleton, Charlotte, Kings, Sunbury, and Queens in New Brunswick and of Annapolis, Antigonish, Colchester, Hants, Inverness, Kings, Pictou, Richmond, Shelburne, Queens and Victoria all show an actual decline in population. The same is also true of many counties in the Province of Ontario.

The tendency to gather into the cities was quite noticeable in the census of 1891, and has evidently been since going on. Various causes account for this. The growth of manufacturing industries, the desire for amusement and social privileges, the advantages of streets, sidewalks, street lights at night and many other things bring people to the cities to live, even in those cases where they cannot better their pecuniary circumstances by the change. And those who have once lived in the city and become used to its greater conveniences and brisker life are very reluctant to return to a permanent residence in the country.

We still find something unaccountable in the slow growth of the Canadian population as a whole. The British Isles lost a million and a half of people by emigration during the past decade, but still made a larger percentage of gain than Canada. Australia, although disappointed with her census, made a much larger percentage of increase than Canada. The United States percentage of increase during the decade was twice as great as ours—21 per cent to our 10 1/2 per cent. The city of Chicago alone gained almost the same number of people during the ten years as the entire Dominion of Canada. These are not pleasing facts. They show that the exodus to the States has been going on all the time, decreased somewhat, but still a very potent factor in checking our growth.

The Duke of Cornwall will stay in Hamilton but three hours and in London only two hours. London has a committee of 54 members to look after the entertainment. The Hamilton Herald advises that two of the three hours be given up to showing him the city, giving him a good long drive and reducing the flummery and addresses to a minimum. The London News endorses this advice. Why should one more address be intruded upon the Duke at Halifax by our City Council?

The disaster to the C. P. E. steamer Islander on the Alaska route is one of the most appalling that has happened in Canadian waters in recent years. Despatches tell that from 65 to 80 passengers were lost. The wreck was caused by striking an iceberg, a danger with which we have hitherto been much more familiar on the Atlantic than on the Pacific ocean.

The death is announced of Rene Edward Kimber, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod at Ottawa. He was a fan far figure at the Capital and well-known to all the public men of Canada. His official functions were chiefly in evidence on state occasions such as the opening and prorogation of Parliament and he performed them with rare and accomplished grace. Mr. Kimber's father held the office of Usher from long before confederation down to 1875 since which date the deceased has held it down to his death.

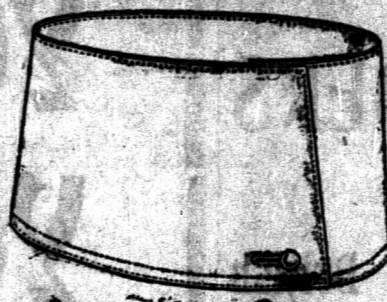
