Reece Team Clinches Section Honors With Victory Over Knights

O'Brien Making Good On Grand Circuit

From the pages of harness racing history comes the story of Sep Palin's mastery over time and distance when his sulky was hitched to a good horse. The veteran driver is credited with having driven 13 horses in miles taken at two minutes or better during his career on the Grand Circuit and other major loops in trotting. Now, while his command of horses is undiminished, and his cannibalism not dulled by years, he has handed his toga — the dark green jacket, white bands and a driving whip, to a younger man.

The younger man is "Canadian" Joe O'Brien, son of Alberton, P.E.I. His task is to keep Castleton Farm Stables in the high echelons of the \$50,000 Consolation Stakes at Santa Anita. He scored other notable triumphs for Castleton in the few weeks he had been with the stable.

Before O'Brien is a long campaign, and since Castleton Stock ranks with the best, his career will be successful. His record in Canada indicates that he can make back horses good and good horses sensational. At Foxboro last year, O'Brien topped off 84 victories in Canada with 44 on the Boston Turnpike course.

Race drivers around the country speak with hushed reverence when they name Sep Palin. The blue eyed veteran of the sulky developed the sensational Greyhound and drove him to world's records on mile and half mile tracks. His 1:55 1/4 at Lexington is the record over any kind of a track.
