**CHARLOTTETOWN AND ELSEWHERE**

Hon. John McLean and Hon. J. A. McDonald, Cardigan, came to Charlottetown yesterday morning and attended the meeting of the Executive held yesterday.

Dr. W. A. Black, Toronto, and H. G. Black, Pugwash, have been visiting in Charlottetown, the guest of their brother C. H. Black. They leave on return this morning on the Northumberland.

There will be service in the Presbyterian Church, Tryon, next Sunday morning at 10.30 and in the evening at seven; and in Hampton at three in the afternoon. The Lord's supper will be dispensed at the morning and afternoon services.

Among the vessels now discharging cargoes in Charlottetown are the following: Kenneth C., hard coal, from New York; Champion, Capt. Orr, Richibucto, lumber; Maud Carter, Capt. Weatherbie, Louisbourg, coal; J. H. Ernst, Capt. Daly, North Sydney, coal.

Friends of the late Robert Pegrum, formerly minister of the Central Christian Church in Charlottetown, will regret to learn of his death which occurred on the 14th inst. at Mauregan, Conn. The deceased had been ill for the past ten months, but was able to keep up his ministerial labors until a short time ago.

C. Leonard Grant, V. G. C., J. H. Williams, P. C., W. P. Doull, P. C., S. A. McDonald, P. C., and W. A. McClelland, P. C., of Empire Lodge, No. 19, Knights of Pythias, Charlottetown, who had been attending the Grand Lodge Sessions in Moncton, have returned. They report having had a splendid time and were royally entertained.

The funeral of the late P. P. Gillis took place yesterday morning, a large number of citizens attending including members of C. M. B. A. of which deceased was a member. The pall-bearers were Mayor Lyons, D. Nicholson, M. P., S. A. McLeod, John Davies, and J. B. McDonald. The Requiem Mass at St. Dunstan's Cathedral was celebrated by deceased's nephew, Rev. R. B. McDonald, with Rev. J. A. McDonald, Grand River, and Rev. Pius McDonald as deacon and sub deacon, and Rev. Dr. McLellan as master of ceremonies.

The marriage of X. George Pavides, barrister-at-law, and son of the late Professor X. Pavides, of Athens, with Miss Gwladys Ventry Canning, daughter of the late P. W. G. Canning, R. N., and of Mrs. Hartley, of 8 Redcliffe Gardens, and grand-daughter of the late Hon. E. Palmer, Chief Justice of Prince Edward Island, Canada, took place at St. Luke's Church, Redcliffe Square, on the 25th ult., the ceremony being performed by the Rev. H. Anderson, vicar, and afterwards at the Greek Church, Bayswater, by the Very Rev. A. C. Pagnon—London Ex., Aug. 22nd.

Then they gathered on the lawn and here C. C. Gardiner spoke on Curing Hay and on Beef Cattle, E. A. McDonald, the member of the district from which the contingent came, gave an excellent address, Mr. Justice Hazard gave many reasons why young men can do better here than in the west, D. Nicholson delivered a well spoken address and Mrs. Cunningham, Matron of the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, extended a hearty invitation to any who might like to visit the college. Rev. Dr. Campbell, St. Dunstan's College gave an excellent address and after being photographed in one great group in front of the barn and a trip on a special train across to Hillsboro and back the party broke up. Prof. Clark is deserving of great credit for the trouble and vast amount of labor and fatigue he undergoes in order to see to the comfort of his guests and for the excellent method adopted of making the work of the farm known and beneficial to the farmers of the province. That it is appreciated was evident by the tone of the visitors remarks on closing their visit yesterday evening. May the good work continue.
