DEATH OF FAMOUS TENOR

The First British Representative of Lohengrin and Tannhauser
 Mr. Barton McGuckin, one of the best known British tenors, died at his residence, Mimosa Cottage, Stokes Poges, from heart complications, at the age of sixty.
 Mr. McGuckin, like his brilliant contemporary of younger days, Joseph Maas (who was cut off early by an illness contracted by sleeping in a damp bed when on tour), was an Irishman. In his day he was one of the foremost tenors. He was the first Lohengrin and Tannhauser in this country, frequently appearing at the Handel and other English festivals, and for fifteen years was principal tenor in the Carl Rosa Opera Company. He also sang at Covent Garden during several seasons. Among Mr. McGuckin's attributes was that of being a remarkably quick study. On one occasion, when a new oratorio was being produced at the Albert Hall, he filled the place of Edward Lloyd at short notice. He was pressed into service in the morning, and sang the part the same evening. He leaves one son, Mr. Noel Fleming.

BIGGEST IN THE WORLD

Largest Dock, Tallest Chimney and the Greatest Bank
 The extremes in age and size always awaken interest. England is well to the fore in this respect, the largest dock in the world being at Cardiff, Wales; the greatest bank, the Bank of England, University College, Oxford, is the most ancient college existing; it was founded in the year 1249. The largest bronze statue extant is that of Peter the Great, which stands in St. Petersburg, Russia, 1,100 tons comprising its weight. Cape Henry, Virginia, has the distinction of possessing the largest lighthouse, and the mammoth monolith—106 feet—is to be found in Egypt. Paris lays claim to the largest theatre in the world, the Opera House there covering three acres of ground. Historians adjudge the far-away city of Damascus to be the oldest in the world. The tallest chimney is to be found in Glasgow, and is 474 feet high; whilst Washington possesses the highest monument, the height being 555 feet.

Echoes of Great Disaster

Some idea of the value of jewellery alone which was lost in the Titanic disaster may be gathered from the following claims for compensation. Mrs. Charlotte Cardeza put in a claim for \$175,000 to cover the loss of her wardrobe and personal effects. Her inventory included a Burma ruby ring, \$14,000; a pink diamond, \$20,000; hatpins, \$500; an evening coat, \$380; and a white petticoat, \$95. The Countess of Rothes asked \$10,000 for the loss of property, including a diamond marquise ring worth \$1,000, some old lace, and a set of black fox and ermine furs. The smallest claim submitted, \$48, was by the United States Government, the value of a mail bag containing registered articles.
