The present dull condition of the market, which has existed for some time past, has carried several of the best stocks off from two to four points from the high level of last month, making them purchases when we consider prosperity has been the same, or better, and the crops, which are the most important factor in connection with the prosperity of the country in general, are a month older without damage from frost.

Among the stocks which appear to be a purchase at present prices is Mackay common. Figures as to increased earnings and improvements are not available owing to it being a holding company but among the subsidiary companies the earnings have been good. This is especially so in the American Bell Telephone and the Commercial Cable.

All of the 50,000,000 preferred stock has been issued but there still remains 8,619,600 of the common to be issued. This latter may be handed out in the near future to obtain money to be spent on laying a new cable from New York to England reducing the distance and increasing the number of messages that can be sent.

It is also believed that an increase on the 4 per cent dividend is to be expected on account of the good earnings of the subsidiary companies. This belief it is thought has caused the steady improvement in its price since the last dividend.
