The much-discussed question of the St. Lawrence waterway development was revived recently by U. S. Gen. Marshall. In a talk with ex-president Herbert Hoover the general urged that the developments be undertaken as an aid to military preparedness.

Dull Trading Yesterday On Montreal Market
MONTREAL, June 16—(CP)—Pluses and minuses were about mixed with no definite trends established among selected issues in dull trading on the stock exchange and curb market today. The list was narrow and changes were mostly fractional.
The average index of the stock exchange listed papers up .52 to 321.99, industrials up .06 to 121.3, banks off .01 to 27.08 and golds up .01 to 77.7. Trading in the industrials was slow with approximately 29,700 shares recorded at the close. The mines were more active with approximately 173,700 shares traded.
During today's session 1,260 shares of Donnacona were traded in the paper section closing at 18 up 1-2. Also active was Consolidated up 1-8 at 12. St. Lawrence Corp. slipped 3-8, closing at 11 1-8, while Great Lakes lost 1-8 at 14 3-4 and B. C. Forest 1-8 at 3 1-2. Brown lost an early gain of 1 1-4 to close unchanged at 4 7-8 and International over came an early loss of 1-2 to close unchanged at 47 3-4.
There were few active leaders among the industrials. Royaltie closed off 1-4 at 20 1-2 while Southmount and Fleet were unchanged.
In the alcohols, more active today, Canadian Breweries closed at 25 up 1-2 and Distillers-Seagram was 1-4 better at 15 3-4. Sicks Breweries neutralized a loss of 1-8 to close unchanged at 14 and Molson was unchanged at 37. In oils, Peabita added 1-4 at 12 1-4 and Home advanced 10 cents at 4.10. Homestead, fairly active, lost 2 cents at 58 and Calgary and Edmonton slipped 3 cents at 247. Imperial, up 1-8 in early trading, was unchanged at 17 7-8 at the close.
In the mines, which showed improved activity, Consolidated Central Cadillac closed up 3 cents at 42 while Gods Lake added 2 cents at 1.05 and Normetal 2 at 1.50. Sullivan lost 10 cents at 2.00 and McDonnald a similar amount at 2.60. Sherritt-Gordon slipped 5 to 3.30 and O'Brien the same amount at 2.30.
Other gainers included Shawinigan up 3-8 at 23 1-8 and Consolidated Smelting up 3-8 at 84 3-4. Bell closed unchanged at 187. Trading box score: Stock traded 153, higher 55, lower 47, unchanged 51, new highs 8 and new lows 8.

Mersey Paper Co. Financial Report
LIVERPOOL, N. S., June 16 — (CP)—The Mersey Paper Company, Ltd., with mills at Liverpool, had a net profit of \$83,640 and an earned surplus of \$2,006,411, the 18th annual report said today.
Net profit for the year before taxes was \$1,635,763.
Gross profits after depletion were \$2,423,237, interest on the funded debt and ships' mortgages leaving a balance of \$2,316,353. This figure, less provision of \$680,589, for depreciation gave the net profit before taxes.
The consolidated balance sheet showed assets of \$19,893,747.

Mild Rally Late In Day On Toronto Mining Exchange
TORONTO, June 16—(CP)—A mild rally toward close on the Toronto stock exchange today converted earlier losses to narrow gains in western oils. Gains weakened slightly on profit-taking following Friday's sharp rise while base metals were irregular. Trading was dull with new features established.
The exchange's closing index listed golds down .70 to 113.34, base metals down .60 to 83.08 and western oils up .86 to 33.75 and highest index in more than six years.
Fractional losses were posted by higher-priced senior golds including Dome 1-4 at 23, Kerr Addison 1-4 at 15 1-8, Lake Shore 1-4 at 16, McIntyre 1-4 at 61 1-2. Lamaque lost 25 at \$6.75 and Teck Hughes 5 at \$4.05. Gainers were Aunor 10 at \$4.60 and Sigma 26 at \$9.75. Juniors were dull except for Thorbold which traded more than 100,000 shares to advance seven cents. Better gainers in the group were Akatcho, Campbell, Cariboo, Dexter, Dickenson, Teku. Losers included Central Patricia, Duquesne, Giant, Hasaga, Louisville, MacLeod, Malartic, O'Brien, Pamour, Pioneer, Sullivan Upper Canada.
Senior base metal issues, Smelters and Nickel advanced fractionally but the majority were down. Hudson Bay lost 1-2 at 43 1-2, Noranda 1-2 at 46 1-2, Sherritt 15 at \$3.15, Labrador 15 at \$5.

Small Price Changes On New York Exchange
(By T. E. Applegate)
NEW YORK, June 16—(AP)—The stock market held its equilibrium today despite a diet of unfavorable news topped by the President's veto of the tax reduction bill.
Except for a few wide movers, price changes generally were limited to fractions.
The Associated Press 60-stock composite finished ahead 1 of a point on the day at 63.4.
McIntyre added to early losses and closed off one point among Canadian issues which generally gave up fractions. Canadian Pacific, up 1-8 at mid-day, closed unchanged. Dome Mines, off 1-4 at noon, was down 1-2. Distillers Seagram also was down 1-2. On the curb, Lake Shore lost 1-4.
Airline and aircraft stocks had to contend with news of the appointment of an inquiry group to examine "the whole problem of air transport safety." United Air Lines dipped 1-8 to 21 3-4; Pennsylvania Central Airlines was off 5-8 at 7 1-2. United Aircraft 1 1-8 at 18 3-4 and Douglas 5-8 at 15 1-8. American Telephone finished off 1 1-2 at 197 3-4. Norfolk and Western "A", American Can, Santa Fe, Public Service of N. J. and International Harvester.
