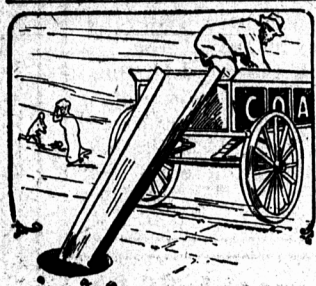

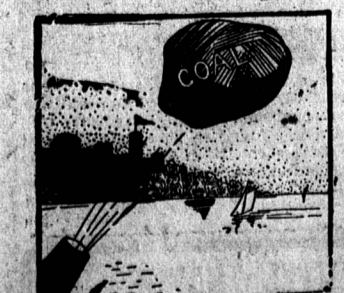


SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of a valuable Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Office or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$100 per acre.
Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.
A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.

The three masted schooner Beaver loaded a coal cargo yesterday and is waiting a fair wind to sail to Charlottetown.—Glace Bay Exe.

Smart Jim, the famous pugilist, was in the city last evening and attended the Klondike-Braun match. In his sparring partner, George Nedel had been there, the stage settings would have been complete.—Moncton Exe. Smart Jim and George Nedel have appeared in Charlottetown on several occasions.

H. L. Hewson, left today for Boston and after spending a fortnight in that city he and Mrs. Hewson will proceed to London, Great Britain, and then to Italy to spend the winter. The News, in common with the citizens of Amherst wishes to extend to Mr. and Mrs. Hewson its best wishes for a pleasant journey and a safe return.—Amherst News. Mr. and Mrs. Hewson are well known in Charlottetown.

S. S. Cacouna, Capt. Masters, reached port at 9.30 yesterday morning after a run of 21 days from Charlottetown. The weather during the trip was moderate, except for the first ten hours after leaving, when a heavy gale raged. She brought a full general cargo including 22 head of cattle, 27 sheep, 6,000 sacks of oats, 6,000 bags vegetables and 2,700 bundles of hay. She sails again tomorrow afternoon for Charlottetown and as there is a large amount of produce there awaiting shipment to this port, will probably return with another cargo, though this has not yet been definitely decided.—Sydney Exe.

Agreements have been signed between the Province of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and British Columbia and the Dominion Government by which the control of the oyster industry is handed over to the Provincial Governments. The Bids have formerly been under control of the Dominion and with none too satisfactory results. Hon. J. D. Hazen is anxious to give all the encouragement possible to the oyster industry and decided it was better to place control of the leases in the hands of the Provinces. An act to this effect was passed in Charlottetown. Prince Edward Island has already mapped out 14,500 acres at the famous beds at Richmond Bay for leasing purposes.—Moncton Exe.

Leo Paul Doyon's name was brought forward backed by signatures but with no indication of his politics. Coderre was very indignant when he heard of the nomination and said that Doyon had worked for him until ten days ago. Doyon is a member of the firm of Doyon Realty and lives in Point St. Charles. He refused to give his programme and is suspected of planning to capture the votes of the Nationalists and Labor men alike.
