### FORD'S NEW HOTEL READY ABOUT JULY 1

DETROIT, June 18.—(U. P.)—The luxurious and ultra-modern hotel that represents Henry Ford's ideals of early American hospitality extended to the traveler will soon be opened to the public. The hotel is the Dearborn Inn—with 108 rooms, 13 acres of ground,

and perfectly appointed guest rooms, coffee shop and dining room. It will be used for the first time July 1. The hotel is just across the highway from Ford Airport, and 30 minutes from downtown Detroit. It will be the scene of numerous parties and dinners which will precede the start of the seventh annual National Air Tour for the Edsel Ford reliability trophy July 4.

All rooms are furnished in early American period furniture, some in maple and pine and others in mahogany. The modern touch however, comes with the concealed radio, tub-shower baths, reading lamps, running ice water and electric clocks. Tennis courts and a golf course are to be added to the hotel property later.

### London Letter

By ARTHUR DEGREVE United Press Staff Correspondent LONDON, June 18.—The mystery and haste of Russia in the throes of her famous Five Year Plan have been implanted in the elaborate business quarters of the Soviet trading organization here.

The tenseness of the atmosphere is felt as one steps into the elevator and is shot up briskly to the fifth floor. There at the door a florid faced Englishman whose speech carries a trace of Cockney, is on the alert.

"Ave a seat, sor," he suggests politely, on leaving to send your name into an official.

Offices line both sides of the corridor. The wooden partitions are painted a clean, glistening white. An executive walks hurriedly through a door. It slams behind him and locks. He does not resemble the typical British office worker, with black coat and striped trousers and perhaps the stiff wing collar.

### Inexhaustible Energy

This executive is also a worker. His hair is rumpled, his hands are filled with papers, his clothing is inexpensive and a fire of seemingly inexhaustible energy burns in his eyes. He takes long strides entering another office where the door slams and locks behind him.

A few blocks away in sedate Canada House a group of agricultural experts from eleven nations are gathered to discuss means of disposing of the world's surplus of wheat. A plea has been made by several of the delegates for restriction of acreage and more orderly marketing.

"Russia is preparing to sow an additional 22,000,000 acres in wheat," says the Soviet chief delegate.

The conference is startled. Simultaneously a newspaper headline screeches: "Soviet Butter Dumped in Britain."

### Efficient Assistants

At the trading organization the hustle and bustle continues. Stenographers hurry from one office to another. They, too, are poorly dressed, not beautiful, but their hurried conversations with officials in the corridors and the nods of approval speak for their efficiency. Finally one is admitted to an office which is plain but effectively furnished. There an official said to this correspondent that Russia was not "dumping" anything anywhere, but was merely re-entering the export business. He denies the stories that his people at home are

The legal profession is not overcrowded nowadays, but there are a lot of people practicing law who, based on their mental ability percentage, ought to be longshoremen. The phrase "There is always room at the top" is especially true of the legal profession, and all the large offices in New York have difficulty in finding competent young men of good appearance and education.

Speaking of education, a young man proposing to study law ought to be a university graduate. There are a number of men who have succeeded at the Bar who have not been college graduates, but you must remember that in the first place, a college education gives a certain polish, a certain grounding, which not only makes for confidence but which brings the habit of study, and in the second place, the college is a miniature world, where the undergraduate is educated not only in the curriculum but in worldly wisdom and where the mistakes he may make do not count as heavily against him as if made in the great outside world.

And then a partner has been defined as one who brings in business, and the contracts and friendships made at college often prove invaluable in the bitter competition of the outside world. If you intend to be a lawyer do not hurry your education, legal or otherwise, and above all do not neglect the physical side. A lawyer who goes to court, who engages in a case which takes weeks to try, with preparation each night for the next day's battle, must have a super-strong constitution. The physical weakening soon falls by the wayside.

If you are living in a lively town with stirring business and growing population, and if you have fair connections in that town, stay there, especially if you contemplate matrimony.
