MANY SAVED FROM A WATERY GRAVE

NEW YORK, May 26.—Seventy-seven were saved from possible death in the chilly waters of the Atlantic when the Holland-American Liner Rydam which collided early today with the tramp steamer Joseph J. Cuneo off Nantucket Shoals Lightship were brought safely to port tonight by the battleship South Carolina which participated in the rescue. The Rydam accompanied by the Ambros Lightship and battleship Texas reached the harbor before the passengers arrived and anchored near the Bay. She was drawing thirty-six feet of water and much cargo containing foodstuffs for Holland, valued at a million dollars was destroyed. A hole in her side below the water line about the width of a plate was stopped the canvas. The Cuneo proceeding to port under her own steam with a badly damaged bow. The Rydam left here for Rotterdam yesterday with twenty first class and thirtyfour second class and twentythree third class passengers. The crew numbered 150.

RESIGNED.—The Guardian learns that Mr Hugh McInnis has resigned his position as editor of the Summerside Journal and Agriculturist, a position which he filled with marked ability for some eight years. He has been a most faithfully whilst among us for all that goes towards the advancement of the province and the betterment of our thriving town. He has for the past eight years carried out a most useful and a brief career which will turn his thoughts again to the strenuous life in which he has so manifestly proved his usefulness.

A BELGIAN VISITOR.—Mr J. C. Thomsin, Antwerp, Belgium, is present a guest of Mrs George Carver of the Forester House, Pownal, having arrived on the Island a week ago from New York. He was in Antwerp when the war broke out, and his description of the state of affairs at the outset is particularly interesting, giving a good idea of the hardships and privations the noble Belgians were compelled to suffer through no fault of their own. He states that no food could be obtained without a certificate from the Commissioner of Police, and then only a small quantity of certain foods was allotted to each person. Bread was the principal ration, and sometimes potatoes and canned meat could be obtained. No beef or fresh meat of any kind was allowed the civilians, as this was all reserved for the army. Mr Thomsin left Belgium on August 16 last, and was in Antwerp from where he later sailed for New York. His people are now in Havre, France. This is not his first trip to this side of the Atlantic, as he has spent many summers in New York and speaks English fluently and with perfect ease. He also speaks French, German and his native tongue. He is an interesting conversationalist for a man of 21 years, and expresses himself well pleased with the Island and particularly its hospitable people; especially his kind hostess, Mrs Carver. He will, at least, spend the summer here.

WILL HELP ITALIANS IN CANADA RETURN HOME TO FIGHT.

OTTAWA, May 26.—"We shall look after the transportation of the Italian reservists to Italy as soon as we get advice from the government at Rome," said General Hughes tonight on his return from the Maritime Provinces.

"We shall look after them and facilitate their passage to Italy in the same way as we have assisted Russian reservists to get to Russia and French reservists to get to France," he added. General Hughes was asked by The Standard if there would be any necessity for mobilizing the Canadian Italians before their departure, but he did not think this would be necessary. He indicated that they would go direct to Italy.

His estimate of the number of Italians of fighting age in Canada who would probably go back to take part in the war was 30,000. It has been stated that there are about 5,000 reservists in this country but General Hughes considers this far below the mark.

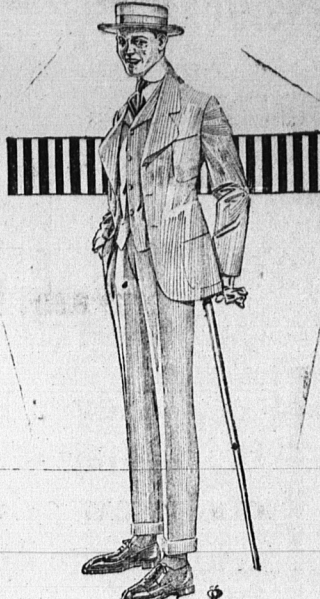
