SYSTEM ON DINING CAR.

The kitchen of a dining car is a striking example of what can be done in economizing space. Every inch is used. Water tanks are suspended from the ceiling. One wall is lined with the big range and heating ovens, while on the other are storage boxes, receptacles for pans, pots and other utensils, and a row of cupboards up under the ceiling.

At one end, between the kitchen and the dining car proper, is a little pantry which serves as a sort of vestibule. That is where the waiters place their orders and receive dishes. Every separate article of food and equipment has its place. Every corner and nook in the car has a particular function. The silver is in one place, the milk and cheese in another and so on through the list. Everything perishable is kept in a refrigerator.

While the car is in action the conductor from his position between dining room and kitchen keeps his eyes upon the ten tables and endeavors to see that none of the diners is neglected. For all the supplies on the car he is held to strict account. On his trip sheet, as it is called, is put a list of everything taken on the car when it starts. A record of all articles sold is kept in another sheet, and when the car comes home again all that has not been sold must be on hand.

The equipment of a dining car conforms to standards, just as do locomotives, trucks, rails, and ties. Dishes are made according to established patterns, each piece of china having the company's monogram upon it. The same is true of the linen, silver, menu holders—everything. The waiters are allowed \$20 a month for breakage. All damage in excess of that, though, they have to pay for, and the cost is divided among them equally.

THE JERUSALEM TEMPLE.

The plan of the Masons, to build at Jerusalem a Masonic temple to mark the traditional birthplace of Masonry, is a striking object and should not be unappreciated. The plan as outlined by the association formed for the purpose contemplates a fund of \$100,000, but should the amount collected reach above or fall below that amount the tentative plans for the building would, as is stated, be amplified or modified to meet the possibilities. The great temple of Solomon at Mt. Moriah is regarded as having seen the first of the Masonic rites and though the site of that temple is occupied, and hence unavailable for the new temple, a suitable site is to be obtained at reasonable cost, in Jerusalem. The plan for the temple has received commendation from Masons, as it logically should. It is an interesting undertaking.

AN IMPORTANT CELEBRATION.

Elaborate preparations are now being made for the celebration of the bi-centenary of the church of England in Canada. This celebration is to be carried out in a special manner in Halifax during the month of September. The establishment of the Church of England in Canada dates back to October 19, 1710, the day on which Subersace after a stubborn resistance formally surrendered Port Royal to Col. Nicholson.

In Nicholson's journal of the siege and surrender occurs the following entry: "Tuesday the 10th (October, 1710), was solemnized a day of Thanksgiving for the success of Her Majesty's Arms in reducing Port Royal, etc., being so appointed by the General, Major Dimes, Service which was performed in the Chapel by the Reverend Mr. John Harrison, Chaplain to Commodore Martin (and now left Chaplain to the Garrison by Commission from the General) a sermon was preached by the Reverend Mr. Samuel Hester, Chaplain to the Hon. Col. Reading's Marifess."

The chapel referred to was known as St. Anne's and had been built and used by the Church of Rome previous to the capture of the town. Later in the same journal, Nicholson states that the Hon. General Nicholson was pleased to "commission" on the expedition to Port Royal, among other officers, John Harrison, clerk, (who is now) Chaplain to the Garrison of Annapolis Royal.

Garrison of Annapolis Royal. The Rev. John Harrison was the first English chaplain at Annapolis, and was still a resident of that town as late as 1732. One of his first official acts was the marriage of William Winniett, a French Protestant, an officer of the besieging army, to Magdelaine Maissouat, a resident of the town previous to the British occupation. He also baptized their child, Annie Winniett, born March 29, 1712.

In connection with the special observances which are to be held in Halifax during the month of September in commemoration of this historical event an elaborate church congress is to be held, at which the new Anglican cathedral will be dedicated. A large number of bishops and leading members of the Episcopal Church in Canada, the United States and England will be present, including the celebrated Right Rev. Dr. Ingram, Bishop of London, and the chaplain-general of the British army. It is expected that on the Sunday after the congress at Halifax, Sept. 11, the various Anglican pulpits in St. John will probably be filled by the visiting bishops and that one of the preachers will be the Bishop of London. It is hoped that the visitors may proceed up the river to Fredericton the next day to see the beauties of the scenery and arrangements made for their enjoyment at Fredericton.

ESKIMO'S SNOW HOUSE.

How it is Built With Its Peculiar Spiral Arch. (Scientific American.)

The Eskimo vault is a true dome, it exerts no outward thrust and requires no temporary scaffolding. It is also unique in that its material is not brick or stone but snow. The construction is used for the beehive shaped winter houses of these so-called savages and is spiral in plan. A row of blocks is first laid on the ground in a circle—or more exactly a polygon. Each of these has a slightly slant top and each thus raises its surface a little beyond the last, until when the circle is completed the gap in height between the last and first blocks gives the thickness for the following courses. In these the upper and lower surfaces of each block are parallel, as in a brick, but the gradual upward trend given by the first course is of necessity maintained.

In each successive round the snow bricks are leaned inward more by having their lower surfaces sliced off to a level. If set squarely end to end they would before long lean inward so far that they would tumble. For this reason the end of the block last laid is cut at an angle. The next following block has the joining end slanted at the reverse angle. Thus it fits in behind the preceding and is prevented by it from slipping inward.

As the house grows the circles become smaller, until at last only an irregular polygonal opening is left. This is filled with a wedge shaped block cut to shape. It is, however, not a keystone, as the remainder of the structure supports itself.

The blocks of firm snow are usually dressed outside and handed for placing to the man on the inside. The last block he holds up with one hand, slices to shape with his ivory knife in the other and drops into position. He is then entirely enclosed in the vault. Only after the house itself is entirely completed does he cut out the low door, which to keep out the cold as much as possible is only big enough to crawl through.

A long, low tunnel is then built in front of the door to break the force of the Arctic's icy blasts. Even the window is present. A small aperture is cut out over the door and filled with a pane of clear, thin ice. All that is omitted is the flue or chimney. Whatever heat is produced by the seal oil lamps is wanted inside, warmth being a more serious necessity in the climate than ventilation or freedom from smoke.
