### PROFITABLE BUSINESS LIFE

What is a "business man's" chief responsibility in life? Robert Louis Stevenson spoke a searching word when he said: "Perpetual devotion to what a man calls his business is only to be sustained by perpetual neglect of many other things. And it is not by any means certain that a man's business is the most important thing he has to do." A few years ago a business man whose wealth was rolling up rapidly came to see the heathen world's tragic need of Jesus Christ. He now devotes two months of the year to his business enterprises, and ten months of the year to missionary work. He would agree with Stevenson. Not every man is called of God to make just such a radical change as this in his business life; but every man is called of God to recognize God's claims upon his life, first, last, and all the time. Then he can live to habitual freedom from the neglect of anything that God calls him to do.

### HOPING FOR SETTLEMENT OF HOME RULE TROUBLE.

LONDON, January 8.—The explanation of the conflicting views about the Home Rule conference between the Prime Minister and the Opposition leader appears to be that while the statement from the Unionist side is quite accurate, that no compromise is possible on the basis of the exclusion of Ulster from the operation of the bill, the Liberals are still hopeful that when Parliament meets some fruitful negotiations may occur leading to a settlement on other grounds.

### IT PAYS to buy in this Province.

(From yesterday's Evening Guardian) FOX RANCHES.—Murray Harbor is by no means behind in regard to fox ranching. There are about six or seven ranches around this place and prospects are looking very bright.

PROGRAM.—This afternoon the judging of Ayrshire cattle will be begun in the Agricultural Hall. This evening addresses will be given on the feeding and care of swine. Professor Elford of the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa, is expected to arrive by to-day's boat and if he does, will speak on the poultry industry. Everyone interested is invited to be present.

"HAS STOPPED"—Usually at this season, as at all other times of the year, numbers of people have been leaving the province for positions, and to take up their residences in the west or in the sister country to the south. This year there is a very noticeable decrease in this outward procession. On enquiry at one of the busiest ticket offices in the province this morning it was learned that not a single ticket had been sold since last Saturday and then only one transportation card was called for. It is probably as a result of the issue of the Times of Moncton states—the fox industry has made money in the province plentiful—there is no stringency—and there is an occupation to keep the people in their native home, and to bring back others who had emigrated.

MORE WRECKAGE PICKED UP.—Marconi wireless from Captain Blakeney superintendent of Sable Island, says that more wreckage consisting of potatoes, dory, etc., drifted ashore on the north side of Sable Island last week from the lost schooner Iona W. of Mahone. It is expected the bodies of members of the crew will also drift ashore there. It is apparent that the schooner was lost on the north-east bar of the Island. A heavy northeast gale prevented the searchers from getting much of the wreckage and as soon as the weather moderates a search will be made for the bodies of the crew.

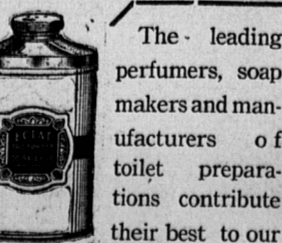
