Mr. Keough had been a patient in the hospital for several weeks and passed away on the above date after having been fortified by the last rites of our Holy Mother the Church.

MINERAL SURVEY PLANNED BY EIRE

DUBLIN, Aug. 4 - (CP) - The de Valera government plans a seven-year, \$500,000 mineral exploration program, the most extensive survey ever carried out in this country. Legislation to provide Mineral Teo, the state-owned mineral company, with powers to carry out the plan will be introduced in the Dail later this year. Government mineral experts said a particular search will be made for uranium, which is prominent in geological reports that extensive lead and copper deposits could be worked economically at present world prices.

TASTY STRAWBERRY TO MAKE COMEBACK

LONDON, Aug. 4 - (CP) - Britons have written poems to their strawberries but now they are luxury fruits instead of regular summer treats. Land strawberries once occupied grows acutely-needed cabbages and potatoes and regeneration of strawberry stocks from a disease called Yellow Edge still is incomplete. In 1924 strawberry acreage was estimated at 30,000 acres. Now it is only about 10,000. However, efforts are being made to increase it and the ministry of agriculture says "the next few years should see a strawberry renaissance that will go down in the history of British husbandry."

LEXINGTON, Ky. Aug. 4 - (CP) - E.P. Taylor, the Toronto industrialist who stepped into racing's big time on the New York circuit last year, apparently plans to continue expanding his racing interests. In the first three days of the 1947 Keeneland summer yearling sales Taylor has spent \$38,900 for three colts and three fillies, possibly a record expenditure by a Canadian at a United States yearling sale. Top price of \$15,500 was paid for a chestnut colt by Fenton out of Transformation and \$14,000 was laid on the line for a grey filly by Count Fleet out of Rule Days. Taylor recently purchased a large farm near Lexington, where the yearling acquisitions likely will be quartered.
