Prairie Province \$433,000 Increase Termed Excessive

OTTAWA, July 30.—A comprehensive plan of railway taxation in the various provinces of the Dominion is now being worked out by officials of the Canadian National Railways and will likely be submitted at the next session of parliament. Already conferences have been held with officials of the Government in the Maritime Provinces and in Ontario.

(Associated Press) SANTIAGO, Chile, July 31.—Preparations are under way here for an elaborate program of entertainment for the Prince of Wales during his brief visit to Chile in September.

Taxation Increased.

EMPLOYED WOMEN.

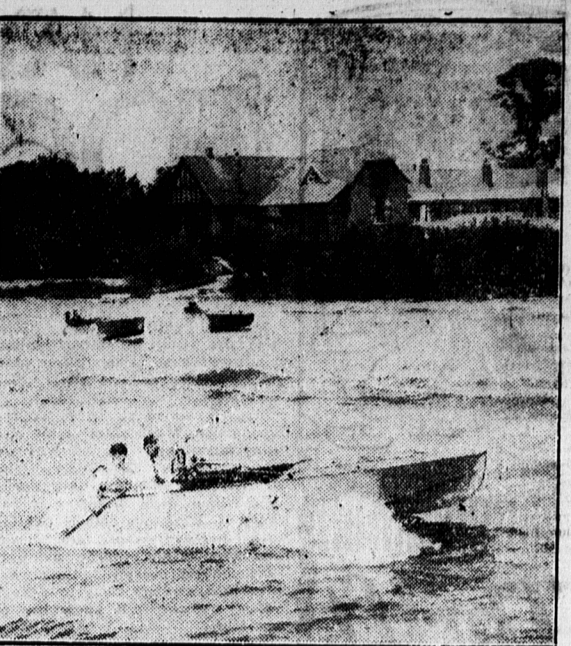
