SALOONS GONE; LESSENS CRIME BY 50 PER CENT.

In the opinion of Chief Justice Walter Clark, of the North Carolina supreme court, the new state wide prohibition law has reduced general crime in that state fifty per cent. Others consider the figures conservative. The returns for last year and this year, which has just been made up, prove the statement of the chief justice.

Murder in first degree showed a decline of thirty-two per cent. in two years, burglary twenty per cent, attacks with deadly weapon thirty per cent, larceny forty per cent, manslaughter thirty-five per cent, murder in second degree twenty-one per cent, minor crimes from twenty-five to fifty-five per cent. There has been a falling off of fifteen per cent in violation of the anti-liquor laws.

Justice Clark has prepared a five year comparison which shows that some crimes have decreased more than sixty per cent, since saloons have vanished.

In five years there have only been two lynchings in the state and none in the last two years.

ANOTHER REVOLUTION IN NICARAGUA.

SAN JUAN, Del-Sur, Nicaragua, Nov. 29—Advices today from Tegucigalpa state that the Atlantic ports of Honduras and the department of Comayagua have been captured by revolutionists under the leadership of former President Manuel Bonilla. Government forces sent to retake the territory joined the enemy.

General Bonilla brought about an unsuccessful revolt against the Government of President Navilla last summer.

Later he sought refuge in Guatemala from which country he was deported. Recently he was reported to be in New Orleans organizing an expedition which was to attack the Atlantic coast of Honduras.

Bonilla's cause was helped somewhat by the rebellion of General Jose Valladares, the Governor of the Island of Amanala. The latter was recently deposed.
