**BIG MOVE EXPECTED**

Major Offensive May Be Launched by Americans.  
WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.—A major offensive, conducted principally by American troops under the direction of Gen. J. J. Pershing, is an event to look for in the next few days, in the opinion of army men in Washington.

Talk of this drive was accelerated yesterday by the announcement of Gen. P. C. March, chief of staff, that more than 90 per cent. of the American troops in France are now in distinctly American units under Gen. Pershing's command. This means that the American commander has ready for manoeuvre approximately 800,000 to 1,000,000 men, fully trained and equipped and anxious to take the offensive.

The possibilities of an American push and likewise the splendid situation in which the Allies are as respects reserves, is revealed by official maps, showing the locations of American divisions now on the battle-front. These divisions have been cut down until there are now only a few thousand men with the Allies altogether.

Whereas Gen. Pershing has at least 35 fully organized divisions in France, only 16 of them are shown as occupying positions in the line, and these comprise practically all of the American divisions which have been fighting.

Where and when Gen. Pershing will be given command of an offensive operation is a matter of purest speculation. It is entirely up to Marshal Foch. Much of the success of the commander-in-chief has been due to the element of surprise and the lightning speed with which he has struck.

**CZECHS HOLD RAILWAY.**

Victory In Russia May Have Important Results.

VLADIVOSTOK, Sept. 9.—The Japanese military staff has been informed that the Czecho-Slovaks hold the railway from Olovyanna to Penza.

It is now apparent that the unexpected climax in the Czecho-Slovak break-through was due partly to the Allied advance towards Khabarovsk, which caused the transfer of a large Bolshevik force from Lake Balkal toward Khabarovsk, and the weakened front collapsed under the Czech pressure from the west and Gen. Senenoff's pressure from the east.

The opportunity is now presented of the Allies taking advantage of the strategic points in the hands of the Czechs to move into the heart of Russia, where considerable reinforcements from loyal Russian elements are certain, and striking a stunning blow at Germany. It is necessary, however, to move quickly, for it is believed Germany will make the greatest sacrifices to hold conquered Russian territory.

Olovyanna is in Transbaikalia, about 400 miles east of Lake Balkal, while Penza is on the railroad, a little more than 600 miles south-east of Petrograd. The distance between Olovyanna and Penza is nearly 2,000 miles.

**Victories Manufactured.**

LONDON, Sept. 9.—A remarkable story is told by a Belgian correspondent who personally saw the incident, of how the Germans are manufacturing victories for home consumption.

Recently at the Courtral railway station he bought a copy of the Berlin Tageblatt in which a big German victory was reported on the western front, where von Boehm's and von Hutier's armies were said to have captured 100,000 French, Belgian, American and British soldiers.

Almost immediately after he had purchased the paper a German officer stopped the news vendor and took away his remaining copies of the Tageblatt, substituting for them another bundle.

When he had gone the Belgian bought a fresh copy of the substituted papers, also the Berlin Tageblatt. It bore the same date as the other, but instead of crushing victories on the western front, it described a great German-Russian victory over the Allies in Russia. In this edition the 100,000 prisoners had become Japanese, Americans and Czecho-Slovaks.

**Pro-German Changes Tune.**

ZURICH, Sept. 9.—The pro-German critic of the Zurich Post writes: "Since the entry of America into the world war, a decisive victory for Germany has been out of the question. The German offensive for 1918 completely miscarried. No counter-attacks are likely to deprive the French commanders of their initiative."

Less than a week ago the same critic wrote in a very different tone. He declared the French and British victories brought peace no nearer. Now he says the Allied first attacks exerted a most depressing influence in Germany, not only among the people, but in the army also.

He suggests some hidden political or moral reasons explaining von Hindenburg's failure to stay this victorious progress of Marshal Foch.

**Ninth German Loan.**

AMSTERDAM, Sept. 9.—The ninth German war loan will be offered for subscription from Sept. 23 to Oct. 23, according to a despatch from Berlin.

The loan will be issued in the form of five per cent. bonds and 1/2 per cent. redeemable treasury bills. Both will be issued at 98.

Will Use Finn Man-Power.  
PARIS, Sept. 9.—A treaty of alliance has been concluded between Germany and Finland under which the entire man-power of Finland is put at Germany's disposal, according to a despatch to the Matin from Copenhagen.
