The following recipes have been triple-tested and illustrate several of the principles of baking with soda: Bran Brown Bread

One cup bran, 1 cup sour milk, half cup raisins, 1 tablespoon molasses, half cup sugar, 1 cup flour, 1 teaspoon soda, 1-4 teaspoon salt.

Devil's Food Cake... Half cup butter, 1 cup sifted brown sugar, firmly packed; 1 egg and 2 egg yolks, well beaten; 3 squares or 3 ounces unsweetened chocolate, melted and cooled; 2 cups sifted pastry flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1-4 teaspoon salt, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract.
